# Valedictory Day Report 2024-2025

Academic excellence has served as the cornerstone for growth, innovation, and success in Auxilium for seventy years. This has been attained through unwavering dedication, intellectual curiosity, and a genuine passion for learning. A total of 39 guest lectures, including 18 endowment lectures, 12 resource talks, 11 international conferences, 5 FDP, 46 seminars and webinars, 31 national and international workshops, and 15 other academic programmes, were organized by the various departments of the college. Besides the curricular pursuits, various co-curricular and extracurricular activities were organized for the holistic development of the students. With pride we present the efforts and achievements of the departments, associations, groups, movements and clubs.

The Department of History organized celebrations for Independence Day and Republic Day, with student participation through speeches emphasizing their significance. Various competitions, including poster presentations, essay writing, quizzes, dance, and historical pageants, were held to enhance students' engagement with history and cultural heritage. The department also commemorated national days to deepen historical awareness.

The Department of English, in collaboration with the Theatre Club and Journalism Club, organized a Literary Meet in July. The Inter-Year Dramatics Competition on The Cultural Ethos in Asian Literature for Shift I was held in association with ELT@I Vellore Chapter. The inter-department dramatics event, based on The Chronicles of Narnia, was held for Shift II. The language-oriented segment of the Student Induction Programme featured engaging literary

activities like word puzzles, storytelling, vocabulary games, and the introduction of students to digital tools. A guest lecture on "English: The Language of Opportunities," was organized. 53 students participated in the Shakespeare Institute Talent Examinations, earning the college the Best College trophy, with a student also securing the 1st rank at the state level. The Peace Essay Writing Competition based on the Pope's message was conducted in January.

The Department of Tamil organized the Muthamizh Vizha, in September, with actor and Folk artist Chitira Senan Kathiri as chief guest. A Skill Development Workshop on oration, singing, and drama was organized in November. An International seminar on "Tamil Mozhi – Internet and Youth Life" was held in December in collaboration with Ulaga Tamizh Aaraichi Niruvanam and Muthukamalam, an International Tamil Online Journal. The Punith, Vivekananda, Vallalar, Gopalakrishna, Ida Scudder, Xavier Alphonse, Bharathiyar, and Thiruvalluvar Endowment lectures and Speech, Poetry Writing, and Essay Writing competitions were organized. TNPSC coaching classes were conducted. Students were also taken for a visit to the DInamalar Office. The Thiruvalluvar Silver Jubilee Competition in February celebrated the 25th anniversary of the 133-foot Thiruvalluvar statue in Kanyakumari, with Minister Kovi.

The Department of Hindi organized various events throughout the academic year to promote Hindi language and literature. In July, the Premchand Jayanthi Samaroh was held, featuring speeches on Premchand and his works, and the "One Hindi Sentence per Day" initiative began in the month of July. An essay writing competition on the contribution of Hindi writers to the freedom struggle was held in August. In September, an Inter-Departmental Hindi Patriotic Song Competition was conducted on the 18th in commemoration of Hindi Diwas. Poetry writing, postermaking and short story writing competitions, Hindi Literary Quiz and a chart exhibition on Hindi writers were also organized.

The Department of Mathematics organized various events to promote mathematical knowledge and skills among students. Notable events included the National Mathematics Day Celebrations on 4th January 2025, in collaboration with the National Council for Science and Technology Communication and Tamil Nadu State Council for Science and Technology, with participation from over 950 students across 22 institutions. The department conducted an Inter-School Math Fest, engaging 300 higher secondary girls from 9 schools, and inaugurated the Aptitude Achievers

Club on 29th January 2025 to train students for competitive exams. The department also hosted a Puzzle Contest and Poster Presentation. The department also secured the overall championship at the State Level Science Fest 2025 at Don Bosco College, Yelagiri. Students achieved accolades in speech, essay writing, poster presentation, PowerPoint presentation, and short film competitions at various district and state-level events. The department also organized competitions such as Sudoku Champs, Essay Writing, Poster Presentations, PowerPoint Presentations, and Mathematical Art. Quizzes on R Programming and the Indian Constitution served to improve students' technical competencies and civic knowledge. Workshops covering LaTeX, MATLAB, and Advanced AI Techniques for Research Writing offered practical training. An Aptitude Test on Time and Distance and discussions on the role of mathematics in digital life and modern technology underscored its importance in fields such as AI, space science, and research.

The Department of Chemistry hosted the Intercollegiate Chem Fest 2025 in association with RUSAC, providing a platform for students to showcase their scientific knowledge and creativity. The Association conducted the Madame Marie Curie Endowment Lecture-7, featuring insightful discussions on advancements in chemistry. UG students actively participated in quiz competitions, and PG students presented research papers, fostering intellectual engagement and scientific curiosity.

The Department of Zoology, in association with the College of Nursing, CMC Vellore, organized a breast cancer awareness program for UG and PG students. Medical Laboratory Technique students visited the Labs at Sri Narayani Hospital, Vellore. National Wildlife Week was celebrated from 2<sup>nd</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> of October. In collaboration with the Tamil Nadu Forest Department, 1000 saplings were planted in the campus. As part of the extension activity, UG and PG students visited Government Panchayat School, Kangeyanallur, and Vellore to raise awareness on health and hygiene. As part of the Innovative project, an "Awareness Program on Higher Education and Career options in Life Science" was held for higher secondary students at Auxilium Higher Secondary School, Vellore. PG Zoology Students won a cash Prize at Nehru Yuva Kendra District level Yuva Utsav organized at Muthurangam Govt Arts and Science College, Vellore. In association with Auxilium Innovation and Incubation Centre (AIIC) an Environmental Expo was organized. A field visit to Fundera Bird's Park, Yelagiri and a Life Science quiz competition was

organized. AIIC Zoology Unit Students prepared Beauty Soap using Fruits with zero chemicals. Six Endowment Lectures were also organized for the UG and PG Students.

The Department of Commerce organized various academic and skill development programs throughout the year. A career guidance seminar on CMA & CA was conducted in July, followed by a Student Development Program on Technical Analysis & Portfolio Management. Other key events include an Extempore on Drug Use & Addictions, an Account Opening Mela in collaboration with Indian Overseas Bank, and seminars on Cybersecurity Insurance and Digital Marketing. Several students participated in external events, including a Business Startups Workshop at Sacred Heart College and an International Conference hosted by the Business Administration Department, where 22 students presented papers. Field visits for III UG students to Madras Atomic Power Station and II PG students to Sri Aurobindo Handmade Paper Industry were organized in January. The department also organized various association activities that include a business quiz, a management quiz, a business proposal competition, "Express It" - a banner-making competition, and an e-poster presentation. A resource talk on "Unlocking the Potential – Becoming a Chartered Accountant" and an online training program on e-commerce and its business opportunities were organized in collaboration with AIIC. Community outreach through extension activities, particularly promoting financial literacy among underprivileged individuals was carried out. As part of this effort, an awareness campaign was conducted to educate people about various flagship schemes of the Government of India.

The Department of Physics organized a visit for 51 students along with the faculty to the U.R. Rao Satellite Centre (URSC) and the Aerospace Museum in Bangalore, gaining first hand exposure to space technology, including Chandrayaan-3 and upcoming satellite missions. The students also won the overall trophies in the intercollegiate competitions conducted at Anna Mira College of Engineering & Technology and Sacred Hearts College, Thirupattur.
