### Controller of Examinations Report

Adhering to the UGC guidelines, Auxilium College (Autonomous) adopted Outcome Based Education in the year 2020-21. Relentless efforts were taken to impart knowledge regarding OBE to the newly appointed staff. A workshop was organized on Outcome-based Education with emphasis on CO, PO, PSO, and Bloom's taxonomy by Dr. Rosaline Ezhilarasi J. Associate Professor, Department of Chemistry. Dr. (Sr.) Arokia Jayaceli, Controller of Examinations, instructed the staff



on the rules and regulations of Examinations. A group of eight staff members were engaged to calculate the OBE attainment. As part of environmental conservation, Jute bags were used for all the Examination purposes wherever necessary and a number of Examination automation initiatives were taken to avoid the use of paper.

### Results

The results produced this academic year stands testimony to the efforts of the Management, Staff and the Students. Students were assessed through Online Software installed for the purpose of conducting fool-proof exams. ## **Oral Health - The Tongue**

Oral (mouth) health includes the health of teeth, gums, and the tongue. The tongue is an important organ that plays an important role in tasting food, chewing food, swallowing, and in the formation of sounds and speech. The upper surface of the tongue is rough and bumpy consisting of papillae which contain taste buds that help in the sense of taste. The tongue is a large organ attached to the mouth by a membrane called the frenulum. A healthy tongue is characterized by its color pink with a whitish coating on the surface. An unhealthy tongue is identified by its color as mentioned below:

- **Red:** A red (not dark pink) tongue could indicate vitamin B deficiency; sometimes it can be due to scarlet fever and Kawasaki diseases.
- **Purple:** Purple color indicates heart problems and poor blood circulation.
- **Blue:** Blue tongue may be indicative of poor oxygen levels in the blood, lung, and kidney-related problems.
- **Yellow:** Yellow tongue could be due to chewing tobacco and smoking, sometimes due to jaundice and psoriasis. Smoking and drinking habits may cause brown tongue.
- **Grey:** Peptic Ulcers and digestive problems could cause grey tongue.
- **White:** White patches caused by fungal infections cause white tongue. Sometimes white lines are formed due to leukoplakia, which may become cancerous.
- **Black:** Poor oral health or Diabetes can cause a black tongue. Sometimes papillae can multiply and look hairy.

**Types of Tongue Problems:** Common tongue problems include Thrush, Burning mouth syndrome, Black hairy tongue, Oral cancer, Glossitis, etc.

**Dry Mouth:** The mouth needs saliva to stay healthy, but hundreds of medications, like antidepressants, high blood pressure drugs, and antihistamines cause the mouth to dry up. It is important to increase fluid intake and to keep the mouth moist. Saliva moistens and cleanses the mouth, helps in digestion, and prevents infection by controlling the bacteria and fungi in the mouth region. A condition in which enough saliva is not secreted causes dry mouth also called Xerostomia. Xerostomia may be caused due to several factors such as Side effects of certain medications (Pain Killers, depression, etc.), the Side effect of certain diseases and infections (Diabetes, Anemia, etc.), the Side effect of certain medical treatments (Chemotherapy, Radiation), Nerve damage, Dehydration, Surgical removal of the salivary glands and Lifestyle.

**Bad breath or Halitosis:** There are 20 billion bacteria in a person's mouth which doubles every five hours. The host of bacteria causes bad breath. Brushing, and scraping the tongue tackles bad breath and keeps the tongue healthy.

#### **Vitamin and Mineral Requirements:**

- **Vitamin A** is important for the maintenance of salivary flow and healthy mucous membranes in your mouth. Not only does it prevent dry mouth, but it can also promote faster healing in your mouth. Vitamin A is rich in egg yolks, organ meats, and fish. Since the body converts



beta-carotene into vitamin A, eating yellow and orange foods like sweet potatoes, mangoes, and carrots, as well as dark leafy greens can help.

- **Vitamin C** helps in the building and repair of tissues and prevents inflammation, protects gums, and fights against gingivitis and tooth loss. Vitamin C is plentiful in citrus fruit, kale, broccoli, berries, and many other fruits and veggies.
- **Vitamin D** is synthesized in your skin when you're outside in the sun, and this vitamin helps to regulate levels of phosphorus and calcium in your blood. Lack of this Vitamin leads to improper absorption of calcium which is required for strong teeth.
- **Vitamin K** helps to produce proteins that support bone strength and the body's healing process. A deficiency of this Vitamin can be a problem for your oral health. Leafy greens, such as spinach, collards, kale, Brussels sprouts, parsley and broccoli are rich in vitamin K.
- **Vitamin B** is important for energy and keeping stress controlled. They can help prevent canker sores and reduce problems with tongue inflammation. Specifically, vitamin B1 may prevent tongue inflammation, vitamin B2 may help prevent inflammation of mucous membranes, B3 (Niacin) may reduce the symptoms of gum disease, and B5 (pantothenic acid) may help with the healing of oral tissues. Vitamin B is in meat, poultry, green vegetables, legumes, and beans.
- **Minerals:** Calcium is very important for the health of teeth because it helps to strengthen the jawbone and harden enamel. Other important minerals include potassium, phosphorous, iron, zinc, and magnesium. Plenty of fruits and vegetables are rich in all minerals.

We all sneeze. Yes, that's an irrefutable fact. Sneeze is the first defense mechanism of our Respiratory system when any kind of antigen like dust particles, smoke, pollution, perfume droplets, bacteria, molds, dander, etc., gets into our nasal passage.

Sneeze is a Reflex action, an instantaneous movement in response to a stimulus, which occurs involuntarily.

ACHOO...!! GOD BLESS YOU! Why do we say that, just because our heart stops pumping during a sneeze? Do you think our heart stops until we sneeze? Is it possible for someone to stay alive if the heart stops beating, even for a millisecond? This article could be the answer to clear this MYTH that our heart stops beating during a sneeze.



Why- god bless you. After someone sneezes...!!

One belief is that it originated in Rome when the Bubonic plague was raging through Europe. One of the symptoms of this disease was Coughing and Sneezing and Pope Gregory suggested saying "God bless you" after a person sneezed in the hope that this prayer would protect them from the disease and uncertain death.

But sneezing isn't just a symptom of Bubonic plague; it is something different as discussed at the beginning of the article. It was from that time saying God Bless You started after a sneeze.

Our heart doesn't stop during a sneeze, then what happens..?

As we feel that we are going to get a sneeze, we inhale deeply which builds up extra pressure in the chest, slows down the blood flow to the Heart, lowers Blood Pressure, and raises BPM (Beats per Minute). Our throat also closes up to maintain the intrathoracic pressure of the abdominal cavity.

When we finally sneeze, all the pressure that was built up in the abdomen releases quickly and instantly. This speeds up blood flowing back into the heart, raises BP, and lowers BPM all at once. The Vagus nerve whose function is to reduce the heart rate at normal times also gets stimulated by sneeze and immediately it also involves in lowering the heart rate.

The changes in the BPM, heart rate, and blood pressure, with their increase and decrease, the heart gets thrown off its rhythm i.e., it changes its beating rhythm for a second but doesn't stop actually.

Sneeze lasts for 1 to 3 seconds, and if the heart stops for this time gap we would die. So, the conclusion is, only the rhythm of the heart is changed during a sneeze but the heartbeat is not stopped at all.

## Growth Factor

At age 16, you can drive a car. At 18, you're legally an adult in most states. At 21, you can legally buy alcohol. But at what age do you stop growing taller? Even if you hit puberty late, you're unlikely to grow significantly after the ages of 18 to 20. Most boys reach their peak height around the age of 16. However, men still develop in other ways well into their twenties.

Research has found that the brain doesn't fully develop until the age of 25 and men usually achieve peak muscle mass somewhere between the age of 20 and 30. Boys grow fastest during puberty. Some boys may begin puberty as early as nine while others might not hit it until they're 15. For many, their biggest growth spurt will be between the ages of 12 to 15. Puberty can last two to five years. Spending more time in puberty doesn't mean that you'll be taller than somebody who spends less time in it. Growth charts show that the majority of people grow just a little after the age of 18. In



rare cases, some people may hit puberty in their late teens and continue to grow into their early twenties. The reason most people stop growing at this age is because their growth plates fuse shortly after puberty. Growth plates are layers of cartilage found near either end of the long bones of children and adolescents. They're the part of the bone that grows longer. Once a bone is fused, it can't continue to grow longer. Your height is largely determined by your genetics. External factors like the amount of sleep you get and your nutrition also play a role in determining how tall you'll grow.

**Genetics:** Genetics plays the largest role in determining how tall you'll be. It's estimated that about 80 percent of your height is determined by your genetics. The other 20 percent is influenced by external factors.

You can estimate a child's height by using the mid-parental method: Add the heights of the child's mother and father together and divide by two. If the child is a boy, add 2.5 inches. If the child is a girl, subtract 2.5 inches. For example: if a male child's dad is 5'11" and mom is 5'4," the child will likely be around 5'10." However, this is just a rough guide, not an exact prediction.

**Nutrition:** Nutrition has the biggest influence on your height. Children who don't get enough of one or more essential nutrients often experience stunted growth Protein deficiency is the common nutrient deficiency that limits height. Mineral, vitamin D, and vitamin A deficiencies also impact growth.

**Sleep:** Your body produces growth hormone and thyroid-stimulating hormone when you're sleeping. Both these hormones are essential for the proper development of bones. Not getting adequate sleep is thought to stunt growth, although more research is needed to fully understand the role of sleep on height development.

**Health Conditions:** Various genetic or chronic conditions can lead to stunted growth. Some conditions include Turner syndrome, Achondroplasia, Down syndrome, Russell-Silver syndrome, and Bone disease.

There's little you can do to influence your height once your growth plates fuse. Even regular exercise and a healthy diet are unlikely to influence your height. You may be able to make a small gain in height by improving your posture. Improving your posture will help straighten your spine but won't make your bones grow longer.

Some ways you may be able to improve your posture include regular stretching, strengthening your core, sitting with good posture regularly, exercising regularly, and avoiding slouching.



Your height fluctuates by roughly 0.3 inches, from the time you wake up to the time you go to bed due to compression on your spine throughout the day. If you measure yourself in the morning, you'll likely notice that you're slightly taller than you are in the evening. If you're still growing, eating a balanced diet and getting plenty of sleep can help you maximize your genetic growth potential.

Children need to get regular check-ups with a pediatrician so they can have their growth tracked over time. Their doctor can compare their growth curve with those of other children their age to see if they're progressing normally. A doctor can also answer any specific concerns you may have about your or your child's height.

### **Celebrating Louis Pasteur's Bicentenary**

Pasteur, born on 27 December 1822, was a French biochemist renowned for his discoveries of the principles of vaccination, microbial fermentation, and pasteurization. His chemistry research led to remarkable breakthroughs in the understanding of the causes and prevention of diseases. He is also regarded as one of the fathers of the germ theory of diseases, which was a minor medical concept at the time. Pasteur also made significant discoveries in chemistry, most notably on the molecular basis for the asymmetry of certain crystals and racemization. He is regarded as one of the founders of modern bacteriology and has been honored as the 'father of bacteriology'. His many experiments showed that diseases could be prevented by killing or stopping germs, thereby directly supporting the germ theory and its application in clinical medicine. He is best known to the general public for his invention of the technique of treating milk and wine to stop bacterial contamination, a process now called pasteurization. He was responsible for disproving the doctrine of spontaneous generation. Early in his career, his investigation of tartaric acid resulted in the first resolution of what is now called optical isomers. His work led the way to the current understanding of a fundamental principle in the structure of organic compounds. He was the director of the Pasteur Institute, established in 1887. By the end of the 19th century, with the creation of Institute Pasteur on the horizon, his scientific work, but also his convictions in science, on how to conduct research as well as on its aims for society, laid foundations for what would become a great scientific school of the 20th century.

Subatomic science can be viewed as a component of natural chemistry or as an area of organic chemistry that is specifically used to study and focus on sub-atomic science, depending on how the terms are used. A significant amount of biochemistry controls the structure, functions, and interactions of organic macromolecules such as proteins, nucleic acids, carbohydrates, and lipids, which create the framework of cells and carry out a significant portion of the functions associated with life. The responses of smaller particles and particles are also crucial to the science of the cell. These may be inorganic, such as metal ions and water, or natural, such as the amino acids needed to assemble proteins. Digestion is the process through which cells use synthetic reactions to absorb energy from their current environment. The main fields in which biochemical discoveries are used are medicine, nutrition, and gardening.

Natural chemists investigate the origins and treatments of illness in the field of medicine. They focus on nutrition by looking at the best ways to maintain well-being and researching the effects of dietary deficiencies. Natural chemists in the agriculture sector look at soil and composts



and try to figure out how to improve crop capacity, yield development, and pest control. Although chemical processes rather than individual particles are the main focus, a significant portion of organic chemistry regulates the designs and components of biological components such as proteins, carbohydrates, lipids, nucleic acids, and other biomolecules.

**Conclusion:** In science labs, a lot of organic chemists are employed. Some organic chemists might decide to focus on teaching, which would inspire them to use computers. A small number of natural chemists operate in the area, focusing on an organic entity's biochemical architecture. Typically, organic chemists collaborate with various scientists and designers. Some natural chemists who work with colleges may offer assistance and a direct work schedule, located in one place with a reasonable wage and benefits.

## Anti-cancer Property of Neem

Plants have often displayed medicinal properties that have been underscored. We often derive medicines involved in treating cancer from components in plants. *Azadirachta indica*, commonly known as neem has been used to treat different ailments in many Asian countries. Due



to its widespread beneficial uses. A. Indica has often been referred to as nature's drug store. Various parts of the plant, including, leaves, flowers, fruits, seeds, roots, bark and oil, twigs, and gums, produce a large amount number of phytochemicals with various biological and pharmacological activities. More than 300 phytochemicals have been isolated and identified. Cancer has become a major public health problem condition. In the traditional system of medicine, several herbal treatments have been proposed, where the neem component holds a prominent place. Chemical components like Nimbolide, Azadirodine, Xylan, Limonoids, and Gedunin are components extracted from neem leaves that have a more potent antioxidant and chemopreventive agent, thus promising candidate for multitargeted prevention and has been effective in a variety of human cancer cells that include Colon, Stomach, Lung, Skin, Oral, Prostate, cervical breast cancer, etc... neem extract has the advantage of easy availability, low cost, and safety to humans.

A chemical compound isolated from the leaves of A. indica acts as cytotoxic effects against seven cancer cell lines P-388 (lymphocytic leukemia), KB (carcinoma of the nasopharynx), HT-1080 (human fibrosarcoma), LU-1 (lung cancer), COL-2 (colon cancer) MEL-2 (melanoma) and BC-1 (breast cancer). They are highly oxygenated modified triterpenes with a 4,4,8-trimethyl-17 furanyl steroid skeleton that constitute one-third of the phytochemicals in neem seed. It acts against five human cancer cell lines. Three of these limonoids 7-deacetyl-7-benzoylepoxyzadiradione, 7-deacetyl-7-benzoylgedunin, and 28-deoxonimbolide exhibited selective cytotoxic effects against HL-60 leukemia cells.

Neem has cytotoxic effects against glioblastoma, human cervical cancer (HeLa), MCF-7 breast cancer, 143B TK human osteosarcoma, and ovarian cell lines. Several studies have shown that they have an antiproliferative effect against various cancer cells like prostate, colon, ovarian, breast, non-small cell lung, melanoma, and cervical cancer.

Methanolic neem oil extracts as cytotoxic effects against three cancerous cells including A-549, PC-3, and DU-145, and two noncancerous cell lines of CCD-18CO. A neem oil may contain one or more bioactive agents that can be used in the future as a safe, effective, and efficient anticancer therapy.

## Medical 3D Printing

3D printing is an additive technology in which objects are built up in a great many very thin layers. The first commercial 3D printer was based on a technique called stereolithography. This was invented by Charles Hull in 1984. 3D Printing was first used for medical purposes as dental implants and custom prosthetics in the 1990s. Eventually, in 2008, scientists were able to produce the first 3D prosthetic leg. In 2012, they 3D printed a Jaw.

Researchers at Harvard University are making great progress in bioprinting blood vessels, a crucial step towards printing tissues with a blood supply. The lab of Dr. Jennifer Lewis designed a custom-built 3D printer and a dissolving ink to create a swatch of tissue containing skin cells interwoven with structural material that can potentially function as blood vessels".

3D Medical Printing has changed the lives of many people. 3D printing has opened a door for people with many different needs. A two-year-old girl born with a serious heart defect had a life-saving surgery to patch a hole between her ventricles. Although 3D Medical Printing is typically known for the replacement of limbs, and/or organs, it also has many other benefits for different patients. For instance, burn victims and those suffering from skin conditions have many options including 3D-printed skin grafts. There is also a special cast that can heal broken bones 80%-90% faster called the Asteroid. The Asteroid was created by a Turkish student, he incorporated 3D printing and ultrasonic technology to make healing a more bearable experience. it has also saved the lives of many animals too.



Future possibilities: Advances in 3-D printing will lead to many great things. Medical technology will soon make it possible to construct real human tissue in a medical lab. Medical 3-D printing, begun with well-known devices such as hearing aids and Invisalign braces, has come a long way. Now there are 3-D-printed implants, 3-D-printed models for surgical practice, 3-D-printed bone replacements, and even 3-D-printed human tissue. In 2013, some surgeons at the University of Michigan saved the life of a 3-month-old boy who had been born with weak tissue in his airway. The surgeons 3-D-printed and surgically implanted something similar to a scaffold tube to hold his airway open. After three years, as the baby's airway tissue grows over time and around the tube, the scaffold will dissolve harmlessly.

### தாய் மொழியின் சிறப்பு

தமிழன் என்று சொல்லடா தலை நிமிர்ந்து நில்லடா

என்ற வரிகள் மூலம் தமிழை, தாய் மொழியாய் கொண்ட அனைவருக்கும் தமிழன் என்ற தனி அடையாளமே இருப்பதை அறிய முடிகிறது. மேலும் இவ்வடையாளமும் மக்களிடம் ஒற்றுமை, பாசம், பரிவு போன்ற பன்முகங்களை மலரச் செய்யும். தாய்மொழி அறிவு இல்லாத ஒருவனது வாழ்க்கை பூரணம் இல்லா பண்டத்தை போன்றது. அது சுவையில்லா வாழ்வாக அமையும். தாய்மொழி அறிவோடு அதன் அறிவையும் பெற்றுக்கொள்ள வேண்டும்.

### தாய்மொழி பற்றாளர்கள் :

உலகெங்கிலும் பேசப்படும் தாய்மொழி மேல் பற்று கொண்டோர் எண்ணிலடங்கா. மொழி பற்றினால் பாடல்கள் புனைவது, இலக்கியங்கள் படைப்பது, மொழியை பரப்புவது போன்ற செயல்களை ஆயிரமானோர் செய்கிறார்கள். ஆனால் மொழிக்காக உயிரையும் துறந்தவர்கள் சிலர். இவ்வறிக்கு சான்று தான் பங்களா மொழியின் வரலாறு. உலகத்தின் இனிமையான மொழி என்று அழைக்கப்படும் மொழி பங்களா. பங்களாதேஷ்வாசிகளுக்கு இம்மொழி தாய் மொழியாகும். ஆனால் 1952 க்கு பிறகு பிப்ரவரி 21ஆம் நாள் அன்றுதான் அம்மொழியை பயிற்று மொழியாக, ஆட்சி மொழியாக கண்டனர். அதுவும் பெரும் போராட்டத்திற்கு பிறகு 1952 ஜாபர் ஹய்டர் ரஃபிக் என்ற போராளி துப்பாக்கி குண்டுகளைநெஞ்சில் ஏற்க துணிந்தார். எதிரியின் குண்டுகளால் மடிந்த இவர் தன் தாய் மொழியான பங்களாவை எழு செய்தார். பங்களா மொழியினை ஏற்காத அரசுக்கு எதிராக நடந்த இந்நிகழ்வுதான் பங்களா வரலாற்றை உலகறிய செய்தது. அன்றிலிருந்து நாம் பிப்ரவரி 21-ஆம் நாளை உலகத் தாய்மொழி நாளாக ஒவ்வொருவரிடமும் கொண்டாடுகிறோம். 1999 ஆம் ஆண்டு யுனெஸ்கோ இம்மொழியை ஏற்றுக் கொண்டது.

### தாய் மொழியும் அன்றாட வாழ்வும் :

பொழுது விடிந்த நொடி முதல் இரவு உறங்கச் செல்லும் நொடி வரை நாம் அதிகம் பேசுவது தாய்மொழி மட்டுமே. ஏனென்றால் தாய்மொழியில் மட்டும் தான் நம்மால் யோசிக்காமல் எதையும் எப்போதும் யாரிடமும் பேச முடியும். படித்த பாடமே மறந்தாலும் தாய் மொழியை நாம் மறப்பதில்லை. நாம் கற்கும் கல்வி கூட தாய் மொழியாக இருந்தால் மனதில் ஆழப்பதியும். விரைவாக புரியும். வேலைக்குச் செல்லும் இடத்தில் தாய்மொழியில் வாழ்த்தினால்தான் முகமே பிரகாசிக்கும். கடைக்கு சென்றாலும் கூட கடைக்காரர் பிற மொழியினராக இருந்தால் நம் தாய்மொழி கொண்டு சைகைகள் காட்டி புரிய வைக்கும் முயல்கிறோம். உறவுகளையும் தாய்மொழியில் அழைத்தால் மட்டுமே இனிக்கும். மனக்கவலையோ, இன்பமோ தாய்மொழியில் மட்டுமே முழுமையாக நம்மால் வெளிப்படுத்த முடியும். ஆங்கில மோகம் உலகெங்கும் பரவினாலும், அது மணம் வீசுவதில்லை. ஆனால் தாய்மொழி அம்மன்னின் மனத்தை மாறாமல் வீசும்.

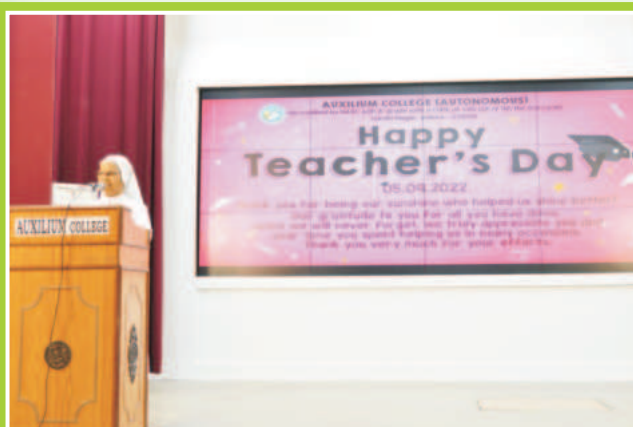

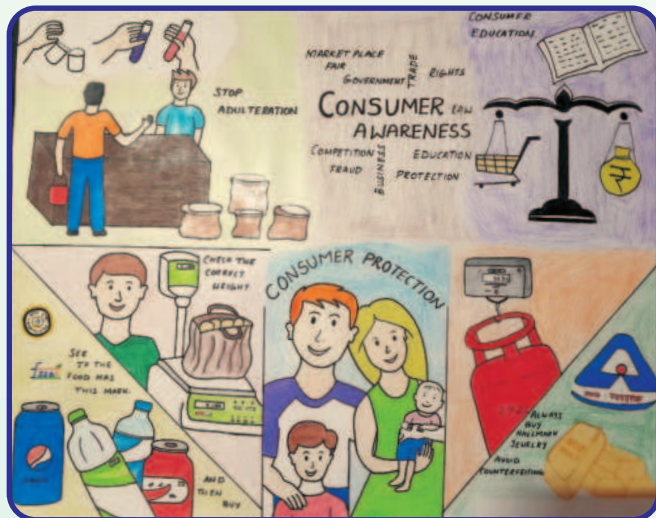

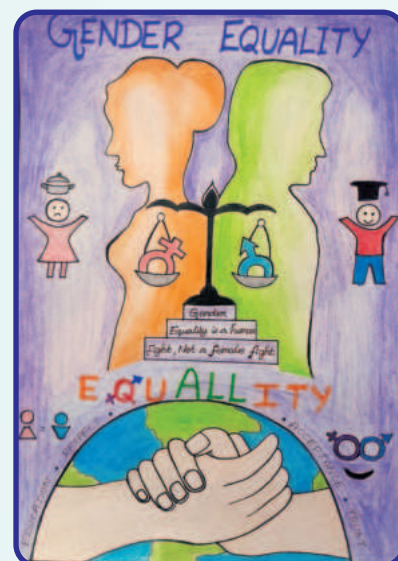
