The Auxilium Controller of Examinations Office, headed by Dr. (Sr.) Arokia Jayaceli A. adheres to certain Best Practices and persistently aims at promoting Ethicality, Efficiency and Empowerment for positive outcomes and qualitative change in the overall performance of the students. E-Governance in the Examinations Management Systems (EMS), monitored by the COE, authenticates transparency and accountability, cost-effectiveness, instant accessibility and extended service through fully automated procedures fo smooth administration of assessment and evaluation in all aspects regarding examination process. #### **AVIAN HOMES**

"Home is a shelter from storms all sorts of storms" – William J. Bennett.

"Home is where one starts from". - T.S. Eliot

Birds build nests to provide shelter and protection for their eggs and young ones. Nests help birds to keep their nestling warm, safe from adverse weather. Birds build nests that are inaccessible, hidden or camouflaged to minimize the threat of predators. Nesting behaviour vary depending on the species and environmental needs. The different types of nests are as follows:

**Cup Nests:** Cup- shaped are one of the most common types of nests built by birds. They are constructed by most passerines, some hummingbirds and swifts, kinglets, crests, and other bird species. These nests can be found in a variety of locations including trees, bushes, ledges, and even on the ground. They are typically made of small twigs, grasses, weeds, mud, saliva, and in some cases, even spider silk. The interior of the nest may be lined with fine plant material and hair to provide comfort and insulation for the eggs and young chicks.

Olin Sewall Pettingill subcategorized cup nests as follows:

**Supported Cupped Nests:** Located in the crotches and branches of trees and shrubs, supported mainly from below. Many passerines and humming birds build such nests.



Suspended Cupped Nests: Supported from the rims, sides or both and not from below.

**Adherent Nests:** Sides are attached by an adhesive substance (E.g. Mud or Saliva) to a vertical surface.

**Platform Nests:** Flat structures made of layered sticks and branches with dirt and grass. Big birds, like eagles, ospreys, and storks, build platform structures so they can have a 360-degree view of their surroundings. They build on the ground or in elevated areas, such as tall trees, cliffs. Birds typically add new material to the same nest each breeding season, allowing the structure to grow larger each year.

**Ground Nests:** Simple depressions in the ground sometimes sides are extended upward and arched over the top making a domed structure. Several passerines, particularly those that occupy open habitat like grasslands. E.g. White—Crowned Sparrow.

**Cavity Nests:** Holes in trees or chambers in cliffs. E.g. Owl, Trogons, Tits, Chickadees. Woodpeckers can excavate the cavity themselves. The size of the cavity depends on the species.

**Burrow Nests:** Very effective at protecting eggs and young from predators and maintaining an appropriate microclimate for eggs and young. Bank Swallows usually construct their own burrows, some others use the burrows constructed by other species like burrowing owl.

**Scrape Nests:** Shallow depressions in the ground (sometimes with a few stones or leaves added) or in the leaf litter. These nests are typically found in areas with little vegetation or where it is easy to dig into the ground. Shorebirds, Gulls, Terns, Nighthawks use scrape nests. Scrape nests are often exposed and vulnerable to predators, the birds must be vigilant and use distraction displays to lure predators away from the nest.

**Floating Nest:** Constructed on water and anchored to surrounding vegetations. Floating nests are made by birds such as loons, coots, gallinules and grebes. These birds require a safe and secure place to incubate their eggs and raise their chicks, away from predators that could reach them easily on land.

**Mound Nests:** Unusual and distinct type of bird nest. They are essentially large piles of nesting material that are piled up on the ground. The shape of these nests can be either cone or bell-shaped and the materials used depend on the species. Some birds use soil, sticks, leaves and even rocks to construct. Flamingos, Malleefowl, Horned coots construct mound nests.

These different types of nest building techniques show the adaptability of birds to their environment and nesting requirements.

#### DESERT PLANTS

Deserts are extremely dry areas of land with sparse vegetation. It is one of the earth's major type of ecosystem, supporting a community of distinct plants and animals specially adapted to the harsh environment. Desert environment is so dry that it supports only extremely rare plants. Trees are usually absent and under normal climatic conditions, shrubs or herbs provide only very incomplete ground cover.

Extreme aridity renders some deserts virtually devoid of plants. However, this barrenness is believed to be due in part to the effects of human disturbance such as heavy grazing of cattle, on an already stressed environment.

Other desert plants survive dry periods through underground organs such as bulbs, tubers or rhizomes. These structures are inactive, requiring and using little water until triggered to grow by rain soaking into the soil.

#### **CARBON FOOTPRINT**

Carbon footprint refers to the total amount of greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide, methane released into the earth's atmosphere, as the result of an individual's actions or by an organisation or by country. A product's carbon footprint includes the emissions for its entire life cycle that run from the production along the supply chain to its final conception and disposal. The calculation of carbon footprint based on whether the focus is on a country, organisation, product or individual, for example the calculation of carbon footprint product could help consumers decide which product to buy if they want to be climate hover for climate change mitigation activities, the carbon footprint can help to distinguish those economic activities with a high footprint from those with low footprint so the carbon footprint concept allows everyone to make a comparison between the climatic impacts of individuals products companies and countries and priorities to reduce emission of greenhouse gases.

Carbon footprint is usually expressed as carbon dioxide equivalent per unit of comparison, this sums up all the greenhouse gas emission not only carbon dioxide and it looks at emission from economic activities, events, organisation and service in some cases only carbon dioxide emissions are taken into account we should not include methane and nitrous oxide.

A variety of different tools exit for calculating the carbon footprints for individuals, business and other organisations. The commonly used methodologies for calculating organisation carbon footprints include greenhouse gas protocol. Several organisations such as the US Environment Protection Agency, the Nature Conservancy and British Petroleum, created carbon calculators on the internet for individuals. Such calculators allow people to compare their estimated carbon footprints with the national and world averages.

So how can carbon footprint can be reduced. Individuals and corporations can take a number of steps to reduce their carbon footprints that contribute to climate mitigation. Carbon footprint can be reduced throw improving energy efficiency and changing lifetime and purchasing habitats, for example using public transportation such as buses and trains reduce individual's carbon footprint when compared with driving and using renewable energy sources, to generate electricity can reduce the carbon footprint by individual and organisation for example electricity generation from wind power produces no direct carbon emissions.

#### NOURISHMENT FOR DYSPHORIA IMPACTING GENERATION Z

Dysphoria refers to a feeling of unease, discomfort, or disconnect from a part of the reality. It can be a part of mental health conditions. It causes a significant decrease in quality of life and an increased risk of developing depression. The clinically recognized forms of dysphoria include rejection sensitive dysphoria, postcoital dysphoria, premenstrual dysphoric disorder and tardive dysphoria. Symptoms of dysphoria include Generalized dissatisfaction with life, feelings of sadness, worry, or low life satisfaction, difficulty relaxing, difficulty finding interest in activities, fatigue, loss of appetite, excess crying and disturbances in sleep.

Members of Generation Z are defined here as individuals born between 1997 and 2012. They are growing up in an age of increased anxiety. According to research conducted by various foundations an alarming report claim that approximately 42% of Gen Z battle with depression and feelings of hopelessness. The study also shows that the most common anxieties for Gen Z include the future, finances, work, social activities and relationships.

Diet plays a very important role in compacting anxiety and depression. Here are some of the foods, which can help in increasing the production of happy hormones such as Serotonin, dopamine, endorphins and oxytocin to fight against anxiety and depression.

### **ANTIOXIDANT RICH FOODS:**

Berries: Blackberries, Blueberries, Strawberries and Raspberries are packed with antioxidants.

**Beans**: Black beans, Kidney beans and Lentils are loaded with antioxidants.

**Fruits:** Apples, Oranges, lemons, Pomegranate and grapefruits are high in antioxidants.

**Vegetables:** Carrots, Tomatoes, Leafy vegetables are abundant in antioxidants.

#### **BCOMPLEX VITAMINS:**

Vitamin B complex is composed of eight B vitamins namely Thiamine (B1), Riboflavin (B2), Niacin (B3), Pantothenic acid (B5), Pyridoxine(B6), Biotin (B7), Folic acid (B9) and Cobalamin (B12). These vitamins contribute to the overall bodily function like energy production and brain



function.

The vitamin B can be found in milk and milk products, eggs, meat, liver and kidney of poultry products, red meat, fish, such as tuna, mackerel, and salmon, shellfish, such as oysters and clams, dark green vegetables, such as spinach and kale, vegetables, such as beetroots, carrots, avocados, and potatoes, whole grains, cereals and beans, such as kidney beans, black beans, and chickpeas, nuts and seeds such as almonds, cashews, fruits, such as citrus, banana, and watermelon.

CHOCOLATE: Dark chocolate improves mood and is a rich source of polyphenols, especially flavonoids, which help in fighting anxiety. One recent study suggests that flavonoids reduce neuroinflammation and cell death in the brain as well as improve blood flow in the brain. Chocolate has a high content of tryptophan, which the body uses to turn into mood-enhancing neurotransmitters such as serotonin in the brain. It is also a good source of magnesium, which help in reducing stress.

**NUTS:** Nuts provide a rich variety of bioavailable phytochemicals that might be associated with anti-inflammatory and antioxidant activities, which in turn has been associated with improved mental health. The commonly eaten nuts include almonds, Brazil nuts, cashew nuts, hazelnuts, macadamias, pecans, pine nuts, pistachios, walnuts, peanuts. Nuts are rich in amino acids such as arginine, glutamine, serine, and tryptophan, which benefit mood regulation. The lower levels of these amino acids in the body have been associated with depression. Almonds are high in antioxidants, vitamin E, protein, and fiber which aids in heart health and reducing blood pressure. Brazil nuts are high in selenium, which improve mood by reducing inflammation. It is also an antioxidant, which helps prevent cell damage. Cashews are a natural solution for depression and anxiety. It's the synergy of these nutrients present in nuts that helps with depression and anxiety.

#### NAVIGATING THE FRAGILE DIGITAL FAMILY

With 6.6 billion smartphones around the world and 20 percent of them in India alone, almost



everyone belongs to the growing digital family. Almost 58.4 % of internet users are also now on Facebook, WhatsApp, Twitter, Instagram and on other social media platforms that connect individuals and communities far and wide turning the world into a global village.

The dangers of the social media and internet connectivity, despite their tremendous potential seen over the last 20 years are very real. On a daily average, a research shows worldwide audience spends 6 hours 53 minutes per day on the internet and 2 and half hours on social media. This leads to addiction with smartphones and tablets that are handy, with their ability to connect anywhere at any time. With everyone checking their devices every few minutes this also often affects social interaction, impacting relationships, sleep and there-by health.

At homes, use of smartphones impacts the family bond as each member remains glued to their devices. With parents working from home, the old dinner table conversations between parents and children or among siblings are on the decline. Even spousal trust and the quality of interaction between husband and wife are being threatened. Every day 38 percent of internet users experience cyber bullying, cyber stalking and cyber fraud cases, some statistics say.

# POPE'S MESSAGE ON WORLD PEACE DAY 2024

An up-and-coming technology that is yet to properly reach all corners of the world but is still very impactful in its presence is AI: Artificial Intelligence. The Holy Father has also addressed this highly controversial technology in his message for the 57<sup>th</sup> World Peace Day which was observed on January 1, 2024. In his message, the Pope highlights the impact of AI in relation to world peace and advocates for an International Law to be created in accordance with this technology.

The Holy Father has given his message focusing on 8 sections or topics. He begins his message with a verse from the Holy Bible from the book of Exodus where it is stated that human beings have been given the intelligence to craft what is necessary for our life. The Holy Father believes that humans are trying to live in the way that is peaceful to all. We, through technology, are trying to perfect creation and better life for all of humanity. Newfound technology such as Artificial Intelligence helps us to a certain extent in our attempt of betterment. The Pope wishes to raise awareness of the progress of science and technology in the path of peace. Specifically, World peace.

The Holy Father then, brings to attention, the promises and risks posed by the futuristic technology, Artificial Intelligence. He is open to the promises put forth by this algorithm-based findings. But he also reminds us of the dangers it encapsulates. Artificial Intelligence may appear to be "neutral". But in its depth, it is influenced by culture. When using Artificial Intelligence for an argument or research, it can only give us an answer based on what information has been fed into it. It does not compare to "human intelligence" of logical reasoning. Even these answers that we get are culturally influenced and are often not applicable. Aside from this, such technology also raises issues of privacy theft and misinformation.

The third field that the Pope focuses on is the "learning" skill of Artificial Intelligence. What sets AI apart from other algorithmic databases is its ability to "learn" from the information given to it. This is stated as it (AI) being able to "hallucinate". That is, it analyses the info given to it and gives a resolution which seems plausible at the beginning but is often baseless and promotes misinformation. Artificial Intelligence is said to help labourers and workers but it often results in unemployment for the underprivileged while helping others.

The Holy Father says about how Artificial Intelligence distorts our "sense of limit.".AI and these new algorithm-based technology feeds us with a false sense of limit and punctures our humanity, making our hearts and brains as "artificial" as it is. All these unexplored possibilities of AI gives us a false sense of security and depth.

Another important question to be explored in depth is the burning issue of "ethics". With the growth of Artificial Intelligence our ethics are traded for something else. An important point put



forth by the Pope is retaining our ethics. Data theft and loss of privacy has become much more common with regards to technology. The Holy Father expresses his concern in relation to the disappearance of ethics.

In the next division, the holy father speaks of involvement of artificial intelligence in war and armaments. He calls for us to change our swords into ploughshares. The Pope strongly expresses his views against war and destruction. He says that using artificial intelligence for commanding armaments distances us from the true description destruction and carnage of war. It hides us from the truth of war and its effects as it puts in a mindset that we have nothing to do with war. Also, machines lack the ethical logic that humans have. Even if they can "learn," they are not fully human. They cannot process compassion or practice ethics. They merely follow the commands instilled in them by algorithm creators. The Pope expresses his views against Autonomous technology in this field. He reminds us that machines do not feel emotions like humans and therefore will cause much more harm.

But the Holy Father also points out that Artificial Intelligence has the capability to help humanity. If put to use by the right person, it is entirely helpful in the fields of agriculture and education. Artificial Intelligence in education opens up broader fields to students.

The Pope also expresses his view and wish that all nations should gather to create a binding law that is international and follows human ethics. Artificial Intelligence is as dangerous as it is useful. How it benefits or destructs is in the hands of the user. It is not enough for only the creator of the algorithm to respect ethics and morals. Even the user and one who may be affected by it must be protected.

Finally, the Holy Father states that he wishes Artificial Intelligence to be a tool for growth and not destruction. He wishes that everyone must benefit from this new technology.


