ANNUAL REPORT 2018-2019

On 08.08.2018, the ASQC members of the Mathematics Department (Shift I) enacted a mime to create awareness on pollution caused due to the usage of fossil fuel. Mime was presented about the past, present and future of how fossil fuels were, are and will be used. On 09.08. 2018, The ASQC members of the Mathematics Department (Shift II) enacted a skit explaining the concept of 'No Drive' – message on the pollution caused by automobiles. They enlightened the students about September 12th –World Green Consumer Day, to commemorate the same 'No Drive Day' was observed in the college.

As part of the Swachh Bharat, the IQAC proclaimed a day in each semester none of the staff or students will come inside the campus in vehicles. It is an initiative to control carbon emission in the campus one day in every semester tenure whereby being a role to Clean and Green India.

The IQAC of Auxilium College takes continuous efforts in developing accurate and attainable and quality benchmark for each of the academic and administrative activity, through a well-organized action plan with various capacity building programmes. As a part of its activity, a One Day "Hands On Training Programme On Solid waste Management and Maintenance of Terrace Garden" was organised on 4th October 2018, to enhance the learning process by edifying the students through integration of various activities associated with solid waste management and educating about the importance of terrace /organic gardening. A Visit to the Solid Waste Management Project site in the campus was also part of the practical experience. Around 370 students and staff from Auxilium College and various other colleges (160 Participants) were benefitted by the programme.

The ASQC members of the Zoology Department and Microbiology department explained to students on the negative impact of thermocole usage, which included a Practical Demonstration of its carcinogenic effect and its non-biodegradable property, and when thermocole is burnt its release of poisonous gases, which can cause respiratory problems. They also revealed the research finding that Styrene detected in cooked food in thermocole packing, which increases thyroid levels.

The month value on 'Gratitude' was presented by the Department of Biochemistry on 19.11.2018. After the presentation, the ASQC members of the department performed a skit depicting the common health problems faced by students. They explained the symptoms and reasons for those sicknesses and also rendered perfect remedies.

The Department of Business Administration (Shift II) presented the month value 'Sharing'. After the value presentation, the ASQC members of the department performed a skit portraying the importance of communication skills during interviews and placements and how so many talented students are struggling to settle in career, despite of high scoring in their subjects.

The Department of Chemistry presented the month value 'Sharing'. After the value presentation, the ASQC members of the department enacted a skit on 'Say No to Plastic'. They elaborated the ill effects of the usage of plastics and its disposal to the environment. The IQAC conducted a competition cum exhibition on 'Wealth from Waste'. Around 50 students from various departments participated in the programme with great enthusiasm and innovative ideas.
