The Career Guidance and Placement Cell of Auxilium College (Autonomous), Vellore, organized a Placement Training Programme on 21 January 2026 from 12.30 p.m. to 2.30 p.m. at the College Auditorium. The programme was conducted as a collaborative initiative of the Career Guidance & Placement Cell in association with the Tech Mahindra Foundation (TMF).

The programme commenced with a warm welcome to the gathering, highlighting the objective of equipping students with essential employability skills and career readiness. The event was organized under the able leadership of the college management, with Dr. (Sr.) Mary Josephine Rani A., Secretary, as Patron; Dr. (Sr.) Arokia Jayaceli A., Principal, as Convener; and Dr. (Sr.) Amala Valarmathy A., Vice-Principal, as Co-Convener.
