The institution has also strengthened campus security by installing CCTV surveillance cameras to ensure continuous monitoring and enhance safety measures. Moreover, during the dispersal of students from both Shift I and Shift II, police personnel and student representatives actively monitored and ensured that students left the campus safely. This collaborative effort reflects the institution's strong commitment to student protection and well-being. The programme received the support and involvement of the College Secretary, Principal, student leaders, Heads of Departments, and faculty members, who shared valuable safety guidance with students during prayer sessions and classroom interactions.
