

Event: Seed Ball Making

Date: 23.08.2024

Participants: 30

On 23.08.2024, 30 students from the II B.Sc Zoology participated in an enriching and

hands-on seed ball preparation activity. The objective of this initiative was to promote

environmental sustainability by engaging students in a practical conservation technique that

encourages afforestation. In just one hour, the enthusiastic group successfully prepared 1,500

seed balls. These seed balls were made by combining soil, compost, and seeds into small,

compact spheres. The seeds chosen were native species (Jamun Seed, May flower seeds), well-

suited for the local environment, to ensure better germination and growth. The process was not

only quick but also highly efficient, reflecting the students' teamwork and dedication. Each

student contributed to the preparation process, gaining a deeper understanding of the

importance of ecological conservation. The seed balls will be used in reforestation efforts,

offering a simple yet impactful method to promote green cover in barren or degraded areas.

The event highlighted the critical role that young minds can play in contributing to

environmental restoration. Students expressed enthusiasm about the project, learning not only

about the seed ball technique but also its wider implications for biodiversity conservation. The

practical application of environmental concepts provided them with a meaningful, real-world

experience in ecological stewardship.







The session was chaired by Dr. Srimathi Kannan, a renowned faculty member at the University of Michigan, USA, and Nutrition Lead at the Icahn School of Medicine, New York. The panel featured distinguished speakers: Mr. Sindhanai Selvan S, Assistant Engineer, Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, Vellore, Dr. Anbu Malar M, Head and Assistant Professor, Department of Food Processing and Technology and Quality Control, Stella Maris College, Chennai and Dr. Preethi Prabhakaran, Head and Assistant Professor, Department of BBA (Hospital Administration), Auxilium College.

The session focused on the critical role of youth in leading environmental initiatives and fostering sustainable development. Dr. Srimathi Kannan, as the chairperson, emphasized the need for youth leadership in tackling the environmental issues of the modern world. He encouraged youth to explore agripreneurship by adopting innovative techniques that are both profitable and environmentally friendly. His success stories from the agricultural sector inspired many to consider farming as a viable entrepreneurial path. The talks motivated students to explore eco-friendly agricultural ventures, blending environmental responsibility with economic growth.

In the paper presentation session 16 students actively participated, each bringing unique perspectives on how youth can lead the way in adopting and promoting green technologies. The topic for poster presentation was "Green Technology Initiatives Led by Youth". The topics presented ranged from renewable energy innovations, sustainable agricultural practices, waste management technologies, to the use of digital platforms for environmental awareness campaigns. The session was judged by Dr. Jagadeesh Reddy, Agriculturist and expert in Zero Budget Natural Farming, and Dr. Lakshmi Priya, Assistant Professor of Biochemistry. The judges praised the students for their insightful research and encouraged them to continue exploring green technologies to address pressing environmental challenges. emphasizing the need for soil conservation.


The rally highlighted the significance of soil conservation in maintaining ecosystem

exercises and games, designed to stimulate laughter and promote relaxation.


The laughter therapy session was a huge success, with students from both shifts enthusiastically


