Formative Programs

Upgrading, encouraging and motivating staff to adopt current trends besides nurturing healthy relationship with students has ever been the prime concern of the Auxilium Community. To serve this interest, various formative programs were organized during the year. The academic year 2016 began with a 3-day Orientation Program for freshers and young teaching staff, addressed by Ms. Rona Doughlas, Former Head, Dept. Of English and Dr. Sr. Jayaceli, Head, Dept. of Tamil. An Orientation was organised for teaching staff presided by Dr. Joseph Kurivilla, Retd. Sel. Certificate Courses

The college offers the following inter-disciplinary and career-oriented UGC funded certificate courses.

The Human Resource Management & Development Certificate Course offered by the

Department of Commerce, Shift I coordinated by Dr. (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Head, Department of Commerce is a bi-semester program working on industrial visits to Aavin Milk Industry, Hotel River View, Ambur Sugars, Wintonia Footwear Ltd., etc.

Entrepreneurial Development Certificate Course also coordinated by Dr (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Head, Department of Commerce, Shift I in collaboration with Vellore Institute of Commerce is a four-month course on evolution of the entrepreneur from all walks of life to enhance entrepreneur skills in BBA and B.Com. students with theoretical and practical assistance scheduled for Saturdays.

The Human Rights and Values in Education Certificate Course offered by the Department of History, coordinated by of Sr. Sumathi, educates and keeps students informed on human rights by arranging visits to social welfare agencies engaged in safeguarding human rights.

The Department of English offers a **Certificate Course in Communication Skills** open to UG second-year students of the college, working on promoting communicative skills, under the guidance of Dr. Vernum Cecilia, Head, Dept. of English. The course design focuses on improving productive skills besides developing listening and reading competencies.

The Department of Zoology directed by Dr. Arockia Mary, Associate Prof. Department of Zoology, offers a **Certificate Course in Medical Laboratory Technique** in which 36 students have enrolled.

The Rural Handicraft Certificate Course offered by the Department of Tamil coaches students in learning various skills such as paper ornaments and jewel making, handwork in wool and textile material. All the hand made exhibits were displayed in an Exhibition organised by the Dept. on 26 August, 2016.

The MS-Office Certificate Course offered by the Department of Computer Science Shift I & II provide Certificate Course in Computer Science to the students of all departments.

Centre for ICWA, CA, RRB, LIC, CAT and TNPSC Coaching

The College is a recognized coaching centre under the Institute of Cost Accountants. Dr. (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Asso. Prof. Dept. of Commerce and Ms. Auxilia Antony coordinate the coaching classes for IAS, LIC, Railways, ICWAI, CAT, TIME Organization, P.O Banks, CA (Group I and II), IIBF and TNPSC. 70 students have registered their names for the class specially for Group –IV exams. Model Tests through online are conducted to help prepare for online examination including registration.

Centre for UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR NET and SET Coaching

The College is also a recognized centre for coaching classes for UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR NET and SET Exams with Dr. V. Suganthakumari, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Chemistry as the coordinator. 156 students enrolled and benefited by the classes in English, Commerce, Chemical Sciences and General Paper. NET and SET Paper I has also been included in the curriculum for PG students in the third Semester of the academic year. The credit of 9 candidates having cleared the SET exams testifies the benefit of the classes.

Sports and Games

This asset of a sound mind in a sound body reverberated in the campus through the efforts of the Department of physical Education. The department conducted the Inter Departmental tournaments for our students in Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Throw Ball, Hand Ball, Hockey, Foot Ball, Cricket,

Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Table Tennis, Shuttle Badminton, Ball Badminton, Chess and Athletics. 13 teams representing the college have been actively involved in sports and games. 40 hours Physical Fitness Programme has been conducted for I Year students, at the beginning of the academic year,. At the Inter Collegiate tournaments our team were the winners in Kabaddi and Runners – Up in Shuttle Badminton, Volley Ball, Cricket and Foot Ball. 76 of our students participated in the Inter national Yoga Day Program conducted by Thiruvalluvar University. 250 of our students participated in the Marathon Race conducted by the Income Tax Department and one girl secured the IV Place. In the International Sports and Cultural Program (RIVERA) organized by VIT University Vellore, 31 students participated and G. Manju I MSW secured 1st place in shotput, and 3rd place in javeline along with cash award. 10 of our students secured 3 First prizes, 3 II prizes and 4 III Prizes in the State Level Public Sports Meet organised by the Tamil Nadu Police Department. 17 of our students received Rs. 24,000/- cash award from Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu for participating in the South Zone Inter University tournaments, All Inter University Tournaments and as members of Foot Ball Winning team for the year 2014-2015.

Auxilium Research Cell organised a lecture cum workshop on the topic *Enhancing Quality Research in Higher Education* for PG and M. Phil students. Students were addressed by Resource persons on topics related to their respective fields of research. Dr. Jayanthi, Dr. Jothilakshmi and Dr. John Paul, Dr. Geetha, Dr. Padmaja, Dr. Reginald Alex and Dr. Jayakumar shared their views and perspectives in the research fields. A total number of 17 PG and M.Phil presented papers from in and around Vellore and won cash prizes for the best presentation in the Intercollegiate Paper Presentation Competition which was held on research topics related to their research topics. A workshop on Human Rights Day addressed by Sr. Isabella Alphonse, coordinated by Dr. (Sr.) Regina, was organised fro I PG students of all Departments. A Video Conference on *Disaster Risk Reduction* is on the pipeline in the first week of March, which is to be addressed by Dr. Peter Davey, Director of Environmental Management School, Griffith University, Australia.

IQAC- The Internal Quality Assurance Cell organised a one day UGC sponsored State Level Workshop on *Enhancing Quality in Higher Educational Institutions through Innovations and Best Practices* in which Faculty from various colleges in Tamil Nadu participated. A one day seminar on *Service Learning in Environment* was conducted for all the teaching staff of the college addressed by Dr. Azhagapa Moses, Associate Professor and Head, Dept. of Environmental Science and Dr. Anand Karunakaran, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Physics, Bishop Heber College, Tiruchirapalli focusing on Green Audit, Energy Audit and Biodiversity Register. In Collaboration with United Board, Hong Kong, UGC and NAAC sponsored a three-day National Conference titled *Journey towards Excellence*. The conference threw light on the seven criteria for assessment: Vision and Mission, Leadership and Governance, Research and Consultancy, Resource Generation, Library Resources, Teaching Learning and Evaluation and Innovations. 15 resource persons delivered resource talks which were followed by Group Discussions and Plenary Sessions.

Association Activities

The English Association commenced with a program on Interclass Dramatics on the theme *Indian Literature*. Sr. Celine D'Souza Memorial Lecture chaired by Dr. Bava Chelladurai, Writer and member of Sahithya Academy, Ms. Shailaja, Translator and Rev. Joshua Peter, Director Quo-Vadis, on Translation and gave insights into themes related Indian Translation. The department pamphlet *Harper* was released by the Chair Person. The Department signed an MOU with Ebek – Business English Course, Language Laboratories Pvt. Ltd. and Mr. Nelson, Ebek Chennai, gave a

talk on the importance of English communication and Examination. An International Conference on *Innovations in English Language Teaching and Literary Studies* was organised in honour of our retiring Principal Dr. (Sr.) Ugini Fathima Mary in which around 80 participants presented papers. A Peace Essay Writing Competition based on the Pope's message is organized every academic year. A Rolling Shield for participation in creative competitions was awarded to the College by the Shakespeare Institute of English, Chennai in which Ms. Thendral of I English won a Gold Medal and Shyanla of II English got a Silver Medal at the state level. An Overall Championship was won by Biochemistry and Microbiology in the Interdepartmental Dramatics Competition conducted on the theme *Mercy and Sacrifice*. The best Actress Award was given to Ms. Janani.S of III BCA.

The Tamil Association, Ma. Vedanayagar Tamil Mandram, commenced with a three-day workshop on Tamil Drama entertaining the renowned Director of Tamil drama, Dr. Parthiba Raja to offer tips and suggestions in dramatization to students, and inviting Mr Sudan and Mr Prathap as trainers. The Intercollegiate Drama Competition for Muthamizh Vilzha, based on the theme Young People and Family witnessed Auxilium College awarded the II Prize. A series of endowment lectures on Young People and Culture of Tamil Family and on Folklore and Young People are a few of the many activities conducted by the Department during the year. A one-day National Seminar on Teaching and Learning Tamil Language -New strategies was organized in collaboration with Auxilium B.Ed College addressed by Dr. Baskaran, Vice chancellor of Tamil University. Of the 210 students who participated in the Exam, on Thirukural from Madurai and Thiruvannamalai, five of our students won distinguished prizes. Ms. Ugene Betilda of I English won the I Prize in Essay Writing getting a cash award of Rs10,000 and Ms Latha of II Commerce (Shift II) won the II Prize cash award of Rs. 7000/ for speech competition. Students won cash prizes of Rs. 3000/ and Rs.1500 each in Murasoli Arakattalai and Vaniyambadi Muthamizh Mandram. Ms. Sindhuja of III B.C.A. won the I Prize Rolling Trophy and Cash Award of Rs. 1000/- at Abdul Hakeem College for an Essay writing Competition. Peace Day Competition was conducted on the topic Non -Violence: A Style of Politics. Ms.Potrisai II B.Sc. Physics got the I Prize. Dr. Kumari, Asst. Prof., coordinates for the all the competitions held in other colleges. *Uttru*, a quarterly magazine published by the Department, is one of the most powerful means of bringing out the creative writing skills of the students on various topics.

The Hindi Association conducted Literary Quiz, Hindi Poetry and Short Story writing competitions which kept the association active during the year.

The History conducted a State Level Seminar on *Recent Archaeological Findings and their Impact on Tourism Development*. An educative trip to Hyderabad for the final year UG students was organised to enhance practical knowledge of historical monuments.

The activities of **The Mathematics Association** kept the students engaged all through the year with Guest Lectures, Quiz Competitions, Puzzles Contest, Sudoku Contest, Speech Contest on *Importance of Mathematics in Day-to-Day Life*, Creative Drawing on *The Beauty of Mathematics*, Power point Presentations, Mathematics Modelling, Drawing Competition on *Triangle Motto* and Mathematics Talent Examination. Dr. (Sr.) Elizabeth Sebastian had attended the 13th International Congress on Mathematical Education in Hamburg University, Germany and a Leadership Training Program on Educative Methods in Italy. Faculty members served as resource persons at State and National Level Conferences. The III Position for the Best Presentation in the National Conference on NXTGEN Developments in Computer Science and Mathematics at Sree Chandraprabhu Jain College, Minjur, Chennai was won by the Department. UG students won I & II places in the competitions in the Intercollegiate Mathematical Competitions at Islamiah College for Women, Vaniyambadi.

The Chemistry Association was set to motion with a resource talk on *Nanotechnology for Chemists* by Dr. Nirmala Grace, Ph.D., Director i/c, Centre for Nanotechnology Research, VIT University. Ms. Revathy secured the Best Presenter Award for the Paper Presentation Competition arranged on the topic *Phytoremediation*. A resource lecture delivered by Mr. Nirmal Gandhi, Deputy General Manager, Thirumalai Chemicals Ltd., Ranipet on *Career opportunities in Industries* and The RUSAC intercollegiate I PG paper presentation was organized on the same day with Ms. Thara Prasannan I M.Sc. Chemistry winning the I Prize for a presentation on *Applications of Bio-Inorganic Chemistry*. The students of the Chemistry Department are actively involved in the solid waste management project.

The Zoology Association celebrates its Diamond Jubilee Year. A book on *Biodiversity of Fauna* in the College Campus was published this year. International resource talks on *Behavioural ecology* for tiny aquatic organisms was conducted and an interaction on museum displays of the Department was held. A number of field trips and endowment lectures were arranged for the students. An exhibition on Physiology was conducted wherein participants were encouraged to make working models on various topics.

The Commerce Association Shift I was inaugurated with Dr. Vimal Nadhan, Director T.I.M.E. Organization, Vellore enlightening students on the importance of e-commerce in the business scenario. The Economics department presented a paper on 'Water Quality impacts on agriculture in the rural areas of Vellore District. Shift II conducted Business Quiz to keep the students informed about current affairs. Stress interviews and activities related to prepare students for jobs were also part of the association schedule.
