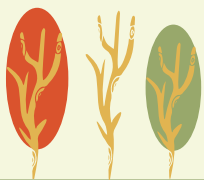

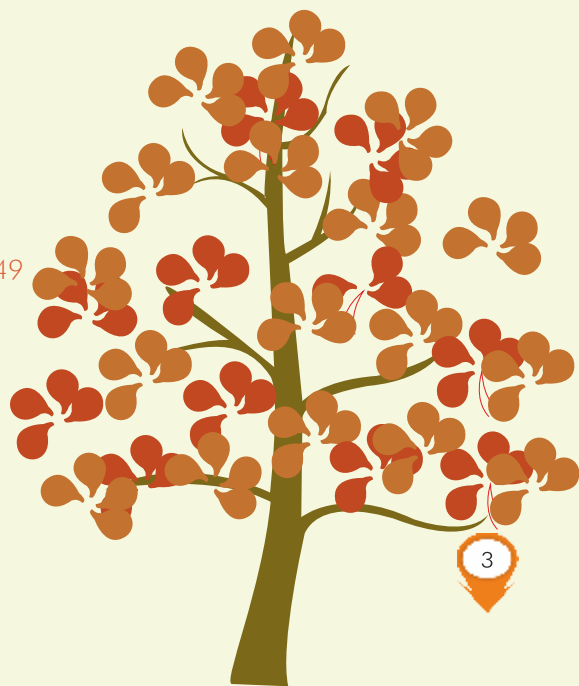

They met the students of the College and gave an inspiring speech on the aspects of inspiration that influence the young people to take up life as a challenge. They also met the teaching faculty and briefed them on the need to reading books on higher education. Sr. Ivone explained about the FMA Universities in the world and the service rendered worldwide. A journey of FMA in the educational field from 1999 to 2019 was presented through power point. She explicated on how the Church and Congregation journey parallely. The Secretaries of various Departments of the College represented their departments and described their respective objectives of the programme to the Youth Ministry Team. A programme animating “The life of students at Auxilium” was performed by the students. The following are the letters of Rev.Sr. Ivone about her experience in the campus.





16-17 July 2019

I am a Salesian Sister (Daughters of Mary Help of Christians' Congregation) who collaborates with the Sector for Youth Ministry in our Institute, and I have come to this Institution or yours in the name of our General Councilor for Youth Ministry, sister Runita Borja.

I felt very glad and lucky for spending these two days spent here in your Institution of Higher Studies (ISS-FMA). Various reasons makes me very happy:

- a) The richness, deepness and interest of all what I saw and heard;
- b) The house full of young people, according to our specific our charism;
- c) The presence of many young women among them;
- d) The experience of a community fully satisfied of its mission, joyful, welcoming and very apostolic, in the constant process of realizing many prophetic gestures. The missionary dimension is an essential element of the identity of our Institute (cf. C 75), which finds a support in the words of Pope Francis: "I am a missionary on this earth, and for this reason I find myself in this world"¹..
- e) The possibility of having a good experience of two ISS-FMA with a great pastoral action, "in pastoral". The transmission of faith comes by the infectious contagion of wide open hearts, full of enthusiasm for life and its beautiful meaning. These communities, with their strong missionary dimension, are typically vocational and in such a joyful atmosphere many young people breathe to the full the spirit of faith and self-giving.
- f) To see that the Institutions is very well equipped, with laboratories and very well organized departments.
- g) The high quality, visibility and networking of the Institution.
- i) To witness how this Institutions is trying to respond to the needs of the surroundings. I made this experience by visiting the Academy of Prison and Correctional Administration (APCA), Vellore the Sri Lankan Refugee Camp at Abdhullapuram, and the Community Development Programmes of the Villages.
- j) The efforto to walk along the lines of the local Church (Diocese).
- k) The fact that this Institution carries out research, holds symposia, meetings, congresses...It participates in local, state, national and international events.
- l) Here in this ISS I could see that it is possible for the various religious faiths and religions to live together peacefully (I personally saw some girls of various different religions).
- m) Etc...

In line with the first apostolic community, born from the sign of Cana, even in our Institute the mission is always communal. The community truly centred on mission is joyful, because it is shaped by the obedience of faith through the power of the Holy Spirit and the Eucharist. It requires and forms people who are humanly mature, capable of expressing closeness and appreciating the beauty of the many vocations raised up by the one Spirit, in a progressive communion of diversity.

I wish you all, my dear sisters and educational communities (educators, young people, administrative staff, families, etc.) that Our Lady can help us carry out our Salesian mission here and throughout the world and to be transformed by young people who are missionaries of hope and joy.

May Mary, Our Mother and Help of Christians, help us and walk with them along the paths of daily life and holiness with the love and wisdom of the Spirit.

May we live to the full Don Bosco's "*Da mihi animas coetera tolle*" for the life and salvation of our youth.

Let us reflect the three phrases of this short dialogue:

First - "The wind drags them"... Inspired by the words of the Rose, we are called to actively and deeply involve ourselves in getting to know the reality that surrounds us and to be careful 'observers' of it so as to be able to help our young people to face the challenges with responsibility, hope and courage.

Second - The other phrase of the rose: "They have no roots" analyzes the consequences of today's wind of change in the society, in the family, even in religious life... in the institutions.

Third - "This plunges them in a state of boredom". These words clearly emphasizes the dangerous state of young people in our societies and this make us aware of the invaluable contribution that families, religious communities, schools, colleges, churches, friends, can give to counter the strong wind and the lack of roots, with the aim of promoting a more fraternal life.

We conclude by stressing that dynamism is a joyful disposition that makes us even more courageous to face our difficult era and especially to meet the very needs of the young people, according to the suggestions of the recent Synod. So, even in the midst of so many bureaucratic demands and challenges, we need to live with Don Bosco's and Mother Mazzarello's Joy, **Allegria** together with their deep awareness of what to do.

Let us entrust all our educational work in particular the ISS-FMA to God and to Mary, our Help, Teacher and Guide. What we decide and put into action today together with many other like minded people, will certainly help all our educational communities to face the challenges of this new times in the great variety of Indian realities.

COLLEGE DAY REPORT

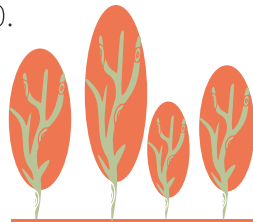

Students’ Orientation and Soft Skills Programme

An orientation programme for all the students was organized at the beginning of the academic year. A Soft Skills Training Programme for a I, II and III year UG students of Shifts I & II were offered through SMART Organisation to equip them to cater to the requisites of employment opportunities.



India Malaysia Youth Exchange Programme

33 students from various disciplines of the College visited Malaysia as part of the India-Malaysia Youth Exchange Programme organised in collaboration with Audacious Dreams Foundation. They were accompanied by Sr. Juliana, Head, Department of Visual Communication, Dr. Beulah Suresh, Head, Department of Business Administration, Dr. Sangeeta Rani, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry and Ms. Ashwini Nagarajan, Assistant Professor, Department of Banking and Insurance. The programme was oriented towards building good relationship to foster peace, friendship and sustainable academic development and global understanding between the two countries.

Integrated Village Development Project (IVDP) Scholarship

Mr. Kulandei Francis, RAMON MAGSASAY Award Winner, President of IVDP extends regular support for the educational needs of the students of Auxilium. An amount of Rs. 7.62 lakhs was extended this academic year to 121 single-parent and orphan students.

Sr.Ethelvina Research Advisory Committee

Sr.Ethelvina Research Advisory Committee was established to initiate faculty research activities and for further scope of research.

DST FIST Grant

Department of Science and Technology has sanctioned a grant of Rs. 49,40,000/- for 5 years under FIST programme to strengthen

the research facilities for Post Graduate and Research students.

Alumni Scholarship

This is an innovative initiation established by the management, supported by the alumni of the College, to provide monetary aid to academically deserving students pursuing various UG programmes. This academic year 45 final year students were granted the scholarship.

Independent Elective Courses

Independent Elective Courses were incorporated this academic year in the Post-Graduation Programmes curriculum, to encourage students to pursue an area of interest and to earn more credits.

Memorandum of Understanding

An MoU was signed with Vellore Institute of Technology, to promote student exchange programme.

The Department of Communication Media signed an MoU with Vaanoviya television network to provide real time media exposure for students in the areas of Script writing, Videography, Editing and production planning.

An MoU was signed between Brainswig Edutech Pvt. Ltd, Chennai and the Dept. of Business Administration and with Multi Martial Arts for a training in self-defence techniques.

Dr.Manivannan, Orthopaedic Surgeon, Director, Manisundaram Medical Mission

Hospital signed an MoU with the College initiated by the Dept of Business Administration (Hospital Management).

He also addressed the students on the importance of bone health.

An MoU was signed with ‘The Bridge Foundation’, Vellore and MSW Department for the World Record Event to SAVE, SERVE AND SALUTE Indian Farmers to mark the National Farmers Day.

Educative Plan

Online Certificate Programmes – NPTEL–SWAYAM Registration



The College has registered with NPTEL – SWAYAM to enable the students to excel in fundamental research by pursuing Online certificate and diploma programmes in their respective field of study, which are mandatory for Post Graduate students. A total of 227 PG students, 154 UG, 2 M. Phil., 1 Ph. D. and 26 faculty have registered for online certificate programmes.

Student Induction Programme

A Student Induction Programme, training freshers in various aspects of personality development and to keep them familiar with



English, was organized by the College. The Haskalah Academy, a team consisting of 11 Native Speakers of the English Language conducted classes for five days to 1214 students, coordinated by the Department of English. Rs. 4,85,600/- was the expense incurred by the College for the purpose. This induction programme has helped the students to begin their respective programmes with much ease.

New Education Policy

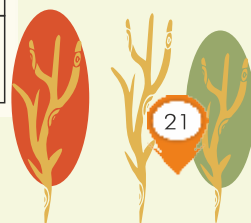

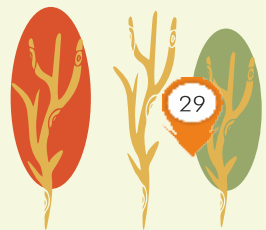

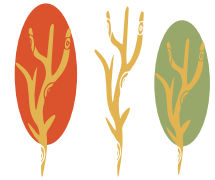
country. It was Swami Vivekananda, who has said “There is no chance for the welfare of the world unless the condition of women is improved.”

To mark the Women’s Day celebration in the College, an Eco-friendly Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine was installed to create an



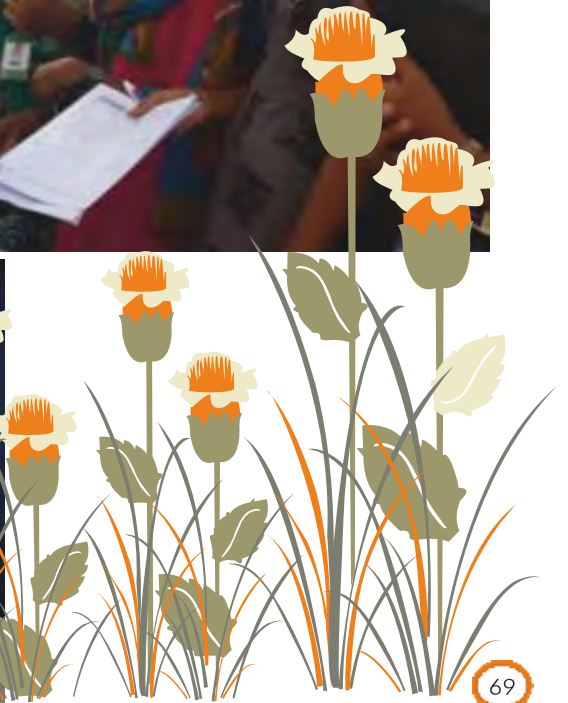

PG DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

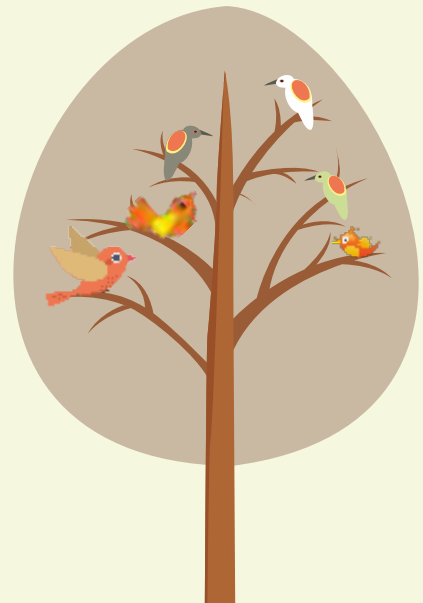

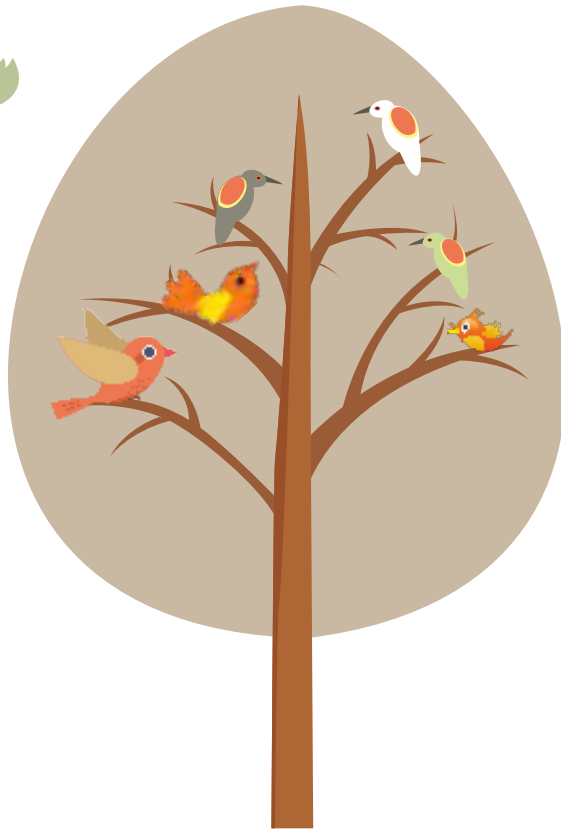
DEPARTMENT OF MICROBIOLOGY

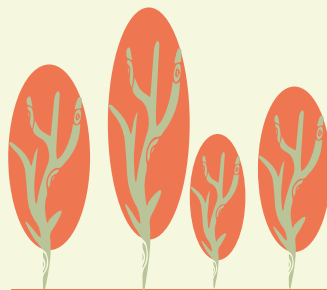

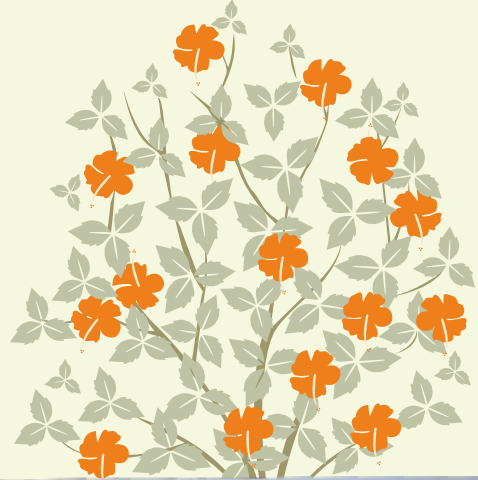

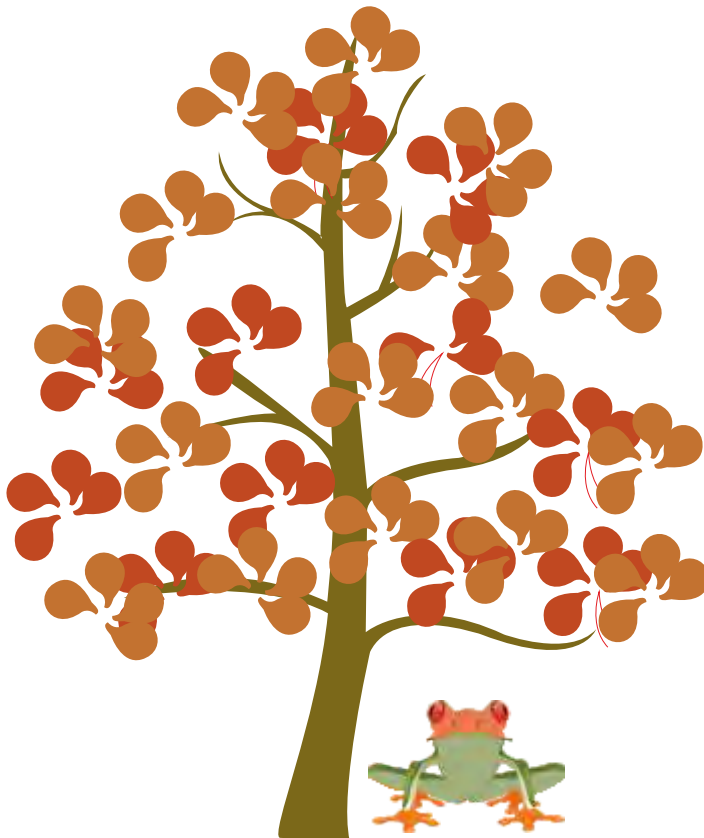


DEPARTMENT OF B. COM. (BANKING & INSURANCE)

Workshops at the Mentee Institutions

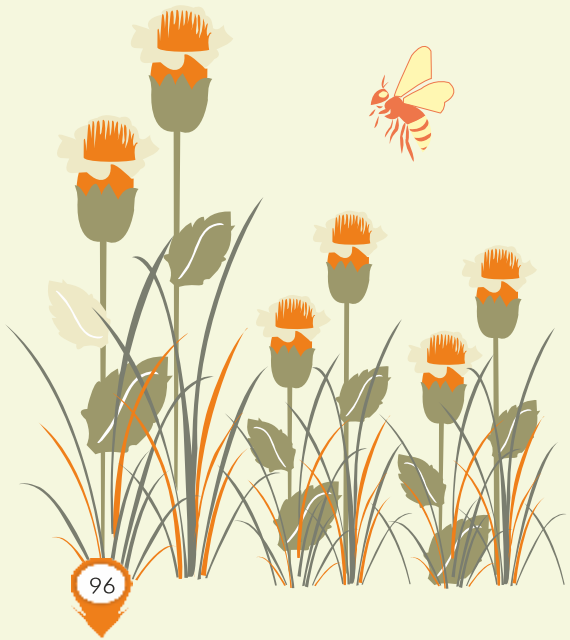

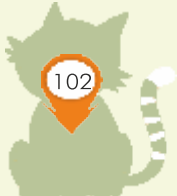

Students met the District Collector on 30th September 2019 and gave the petition regarding laying of proper road, providing speed breakers, to take action on smoking in the public places.

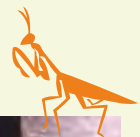
On 3rd October 2019 'Product Puzzle' Competition was held. It was on Logo identification and on food safety measures.

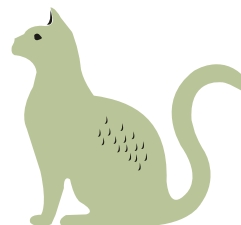
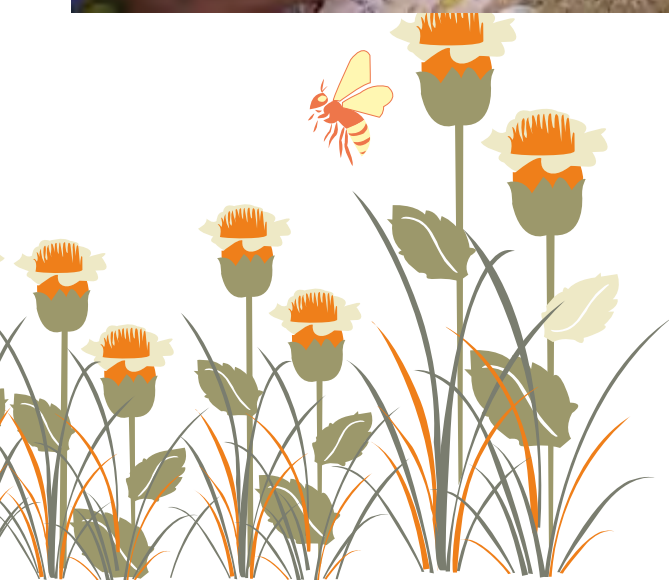

and flowers Beekeeping activity will motivate the entrepreneurial skills among the student community towards the production of organic honey.

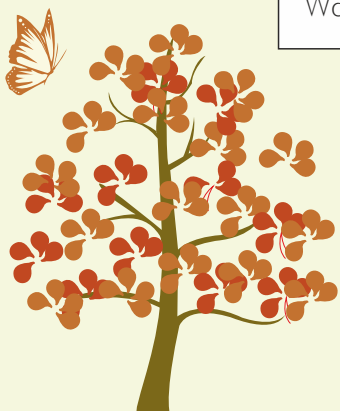

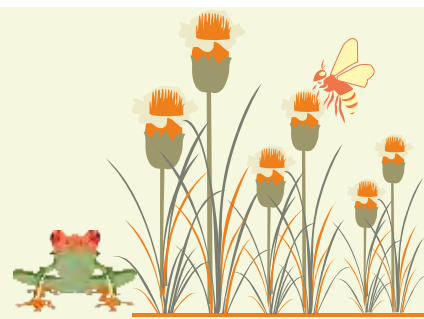
A workshop on “Seed Pen Making” was conducted on 29th November. These pens were made of recycled papers and contain seeds of various vegetables. All the Enviro

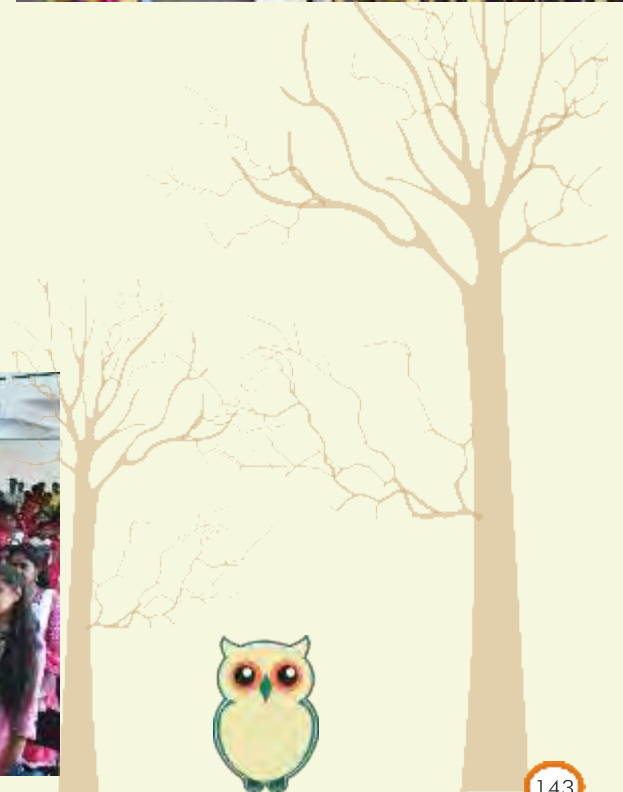
Motivational Talk on Girl Child Safety

Blue Biotechnology

Marine life has adapted to thrive in the extreme ambient conditions found in the sea. Blue biotechnology is concerned with the exploration and exploitation of the resulting diverse marine organisms in order to develop new products.

Blue biotechnology is biotechnology using aquatic organisms - think 'blue' for the water that these organisms live in. We already utilize many aquatic resources such as fish, shellfish, sponges, and petroleum reserves. But blue biotechnology goes beyond this, utilizing an incredible variety of organisms from Earth's oceans, lakes, rivers, and streams for many different purposes.

The scope of the blue biotechnology therefore includes activities that:

- explore and develop ocean resources;
- use ocean and coastal space;
- protect the ocean environment;
- use ocean products as a main input;
- provide goods and services to support ocean activities; and
- develop mechanisms to ensure the equitable sharing of national wealth derived from the blue economy.

One of the most conspicuous applications of marine biotechnology is securing the food supply. For instance, the omega-3 fatty acids derived from fish oil, marine

algae, and phytoplankton play an important role in the human diet and human physiology.

Proteins, enzymes, biopolymers, bio-adhesives, and biomaterials are produced on a large scale from the marine ecosystem. Notable examples of marine biotechnology products are Green Fluorescent Protein from jellyfish and luciferase enzyme from *Vibrio fischeri* (marine bacteria), both being used in molecular biology as reporter proteins.

Many painkillers that are commonly prescribed have the unfortunate side effect of drowsiness. They also tend to slow down your body in general, such as your respiration. A substance called ziconotide, which comes from the venom of cone snails, may prove to be a better alternative. Ziconotide works as a painkiller that, when injected directly into your spinal cord, is both far more powerful than morphine and also only acts in specific regions of the spinal cord. This means that unlike other painkillers, it doesn't affect your entire nervous system, and doesn't cause drowsiness.

In addition to medical products, blue biotechnology can also be used for cosmetic products. such as perfumes and facial and body care products. Algae have a variety of other applications as well. It is a food source for both people and fish. It is used in antibacterial, antiviral, and antifungal treatments. It is a source of biofuel.

Though you might think that jellyfish are only good for stinging, they have proven to be

quite useful in blue biotechnology. For example, the luminescent properties of the species of jellyfish *Aequorea victoria* are being used to help map neurons in the human brain. Your brain is a complex web of neural connections, and being able to identify which connections go where, can help Researchers better understand. Jellyfish are also being used to create a source of medical-grade collagen, which can be used to treat bones and wounds. Using jellyfish is more cost effective and is less controversial than other sources of collagen, as from mammals.

Human beings are discovering a lot of things from nature that helps to uplift life on earth. Despite providing useful things to humans and environment, the blue environment is being destroyed day by day. Yes! We do pollute the marine environment throughout our life and destroy all those beneficial creatures. Let us make them live and yield more from them.

DISEASE OUTBREAK IN THE PAST

Over the past years, India has faced a variety of disease outbreak, killing thousands of people in no time. Many cases of Zika, Japanese Encephalitis, Chikunguniya, Nipah, Cholera, Dengue have been reported. The main reason for

the country to face such outbreak is lack of sanitation, lack of public health system and most importantly, malnutrition.

Today, India is witnessing one of the most fatal and widespread outbreak, COVID-19 which is a new strain of Coronavirus discovered in 2019.

What is the difference between Epidemic and Pandemic?

Pandemic is a disease which spreads across many countries and affects a large number of people in the affected geographical areas. Whereas, Epidemic is when there is rise in the number of reported cases beyond what is expected in the area. On 11th March, 2020 WHO categorized COVID-19 as a Pandemic.

1. CHOLERA IN 2003

An outbreak of severe diarrhoea was reported from a village in Orissa, eastern India on November 2003. Few of the cases were hospitalized.

2. SARS IN 2003

SARS (severe acute respiratory syndrome), is considered as the first serious infectious disease outbreak of the twenty-first century. It initially started in the Guangdong province of China in 2003 and spread quickly to about 30 countries across Asia, Americas and Europe and accounted for a total of 8,439 cases and 812 deaths, within 7 to 8 months.

3. MENINGOCOCCAL FEVER IN 2005

More than 100 cases were reported in Delhi from 29th March until 6 May, 2005.



Majority of the cases and deaths were seen in young adults. Presence of *Neisseria meningitidis* serogroup A in the CSF were obtained from these cases.

4. JAPANESE ENCEPHALITIS IN 2005

An outbreak of viral encephalitis was reported in Gorakhpur, Uttar Pradesh from July to November, 2005. It was one of the longest and severe epidemic causing more than 1000 deaths. High temperature and relative humidity provided a suitable environment for Japanese Encephalitis Virus (JEV) transmission.

5. CHIKUNGUNYA IN 2006

From February 2006 to 10 October 2006, the WHO Regional Office for South-East Asia has reported 151 districts in 8 states/provinces of India affected by chikungunya fever which included Andhra Pradesh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka, Maharashtra, Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, Kerala and Delhi. They carried out clinical and epidemiological examinations of suspected cases in hospitals and at home, and collected clinical samples. An entomological survey revealed high densities of *Aedes albopictus* in the affected areas as well as in areas not affected by the disease. [WHO]

6. ZIKA VIRUS IN 2017

On 21 September 2018, India reported a confirmed case of Zika virus infection in a 78 year-old woman in Jaipur, Rajasthan state. Later by November, 2018, 157 cases

were identified, including 63 pregnant women.

7. NIPAH VIRUS IN 2018

In July, 2018 a total of 19 Nipah Virus (NiV) cases were reported in two districts of Kerala State: Kozhikode and Malappuram. Acute respiratory distress syndrome and encephalitis were observed among the patients infected *Pteropus giganteus* bats (the reservoir of NiV infection) were collected from areas around the house of the index case in Kozhikode, Kerala to understand the circulation of NiV in bats in the affected area; 19% (10 of 52) of the bats were found positive NiV.

8. COVID-19 2020

COVID-19 is an infectious disease caused by SARS Coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). The first outbreak was seen in Wuhan, China in December 2019. As of 15th April 2020, more than 2 million cases have been reported in 210 countries. The virus is mainly transmitted through droplets generated when an infected person coughs, sneezes or speaks. The first case of corona virus pandemic was confirmed on 30th January 2020, in Kerala. Now India is found with more than 10000 cases as of 15th April 2020, widespread across the whole country.

Hormones and our Emotions

Emotions are very complex and have different meanings to different people but essentially, emotions are a conscious experience that are categorized by states of mind, external and internal reactions, and expressions. Emotions come from the arousal of the nervous system. Millions of chemical reactions take place in the brain at any given time. Hormones are chemical that carry messages from the brain to the different organs and tissues. Hormones control basic human functions (like sleeping, eating) complex functions (like reproduction) and also our emotions and mood. Hormones keep the body working normally.

Our hormones impact our neurotransmitter levels, therefore if hormones are out of balance, your neurotransmitter levels will have a flow-on effect on mood. The human body uses the endocrine system for communication, in conjunction with the nervous system. The neurotransmitters work as messengers for the nervous system, while hormones work as messengers for the endocrine system. Hormonal flow is linked to the neural network. Neurons communicate information about bodily functions to the pituitary gland, which then triggers the endocrine glands to increase or decrease the production of hormones. This system works based on environmental

stimuli and affects your response and your emotional state. Hormones may affect both positive and negative emotions. The positive emotions include love, happiness, surprise. Whereas, the negative emotions are composed of hatred, sadness, anger and disgust. There are some hormones that are especially responsible for the regulation of emotions and controlling them. Expression is also a major part of emotions.

There are hormones whose production is involuntary, like the insulin produced by the pancreas; a deficiency of this hormone is a basic cause of diabetes. The fluctuation of oestrogen in females controls their monthly menstrual cycle.

Serotonin is an important chemical and neurotransmitter in the human body. It regulates mood and social behaviour, appetite and digestion, sleep, memory, and function. It causes the feeling of safety calmness, happiness and self-confidence. Deficiency causes low self-esteem, obsessive thoughts, compulsive behaviour, impulsiveness and aggressiveness. Endorphins hormone cause really good mood also euphoric and provide energy to “go an extra mile”, decreasing the feeling of being tired. Deficiency of endorphins causes mood swings and extreme, contrasting emotions. It is released e.g. by physical exercises and movement. Endorphins acts as analgesics, which means they diminish the perception of pain.

Oxytocin is a powerful hormone that acts as a neuro transmitter in the brain. It helps to

create social bonds and maintain them, causes the feeling of belonging and connection (also love). It is released during physical and eye contact with other people. Plays major role in behaviours from maternal attachment to an infant and in lactation. Dopamine is reward hormone , it is a feel god neuro transmitter. This boosts mood, motivation and attention, helps regulate movement, learning, and emotional responses.

Testosterone is a male sex hormone that plays a vital role in puberty. Higher amounts of this hormone leads to sadness, rage, fear or anxiety they affect negative emotions in aggression. Oestrogen are female hormones. if they are normal and balanced by progesterone a women feels well. Low levels leads to sadness which causes depression. The Thyroid hormone stimulates cell functions in body cells including the brain. A low level of this hormone causes depression and lack of energy.

Hormones are driving forces behind our various emotions. Hormones affect emotions in order to convey our thoughts, feelings and intended actions towards other people. Thus emotion and hormone coexist.

IMMORTALITY IS REAL: Study on real creatures that never die of natural causes

No one likes the thought of growing old. But the process of ageing is an inevitable part of life. Senescence is the state of gradual deterioration of normal functioning. At the cellular level, it means cells stop dividing and they eventually die. It can apply to an entire organism or to specific organs or tissues. However, a few species can escape the ageing process completely.

The immortal jelly fish Turritopsisdohrnii:

The jellyfish *Turritopsisdohrnii* is a small transparent animal which hangs out in oceans around the world. A new jellyfish life begins with a fertilized egg, which grows into a larval stage called a planula. After a quick swim, the planula attaches itself to a surface like rock, where it develops into a polyp: a tube-shaped structure with a mouth at one end and a kind of foot at the other. Eventually, one of these polyps will form an outgrowth called a ‘bud’ or it may produce separate segments stacked on top of one another that can break away from the rest of the colony. This process is responsible for the next stages of jellyfish life cycle: the ephyra (a small jelly fish) and the medusa, which is the fully-formed adult stage capable of sexual reproduction.

For other jellyfish this stage is the end of life. But *Turritopsisdohrnii*, when it faces any environmental stress like starvation or injury, it can revert back to being a tiny blob of tissue, which then changes back into the sexually immature polyp phase of life. It is a

like a butterfly turning back into a caterpillar or a frog becoming a tadpole again.

Hydra

Hydra has a tubular body with a tentacle-ringed mouth at one end and an adhesive foot at the other. It seems that they don’t go through senescence at all. Instead of gradually deteriorating over time, a hydra’s stem cells have the capacity for infinite self-renewal. This is because of a particular set of genes called FoxO genes. When Researchers prevented FoxO genes from functioning, they found that hydra’s cells began to show signs of ageing and would no longer regenerate as they did before. Thus, these genes clearly play an important role in maintaining hydra's endless youthfulness.

Immortal lobsters

Lobsters also do not experience senescence. Their longevity is because of their ability to endlessly repair their DNA. During the process of DNA copying and cell division, the protective end-caps on chromosomes, called telomeres, slowly get shorter and shorter and when they are too short, a cell enters senescence and can no longer keep dividing. But, lobsters have a never-ending supply of an enzyme called telomerase, which works to keep regenerating telomeres. They produce a lot of this enzyme in all of their cells throughout their adult lives, allowing them to maintain youthful DNA indefinitely.
