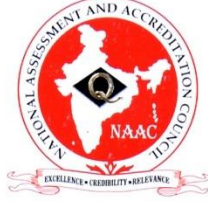

NAAC PEER TEAM REPORT

The NAAC peer team members comprising of the Chair Person, Dr.M.O. Koshy, Former Pro-Vice Chancellor, Kannur University, Kerala, Member Coordinator, Dr.Naresh K. Patel, Dean, Faculty of Management and Information Sciences, Dharmsinh Desai University, Nadiad, Gujarat, Member Dr. Shiv Kumar Saxena, Principal, Pt. SNS Government PG Autonomous College, Shahdol, Madhya Pradesh, NAAC Officer, Dr. M.S. Shyamsundar visited the college from 29th to 31st August 2016 to assess the college for the third cycle of accreditation.

The team appreciated the well defined academic framework which helps in the design and development of the curriculum to meet the local, national and international requirements. The academic flexibility through CBCS and the options for supplementary and enrichment courses, regular revision of the syllabi, value - added programmes, academic audit, feedback system and the monitoring of quality sustenance and quality enhancement are some of the features highlighted by the peer team. Transparency in admission process, Orientation programme for the freshers, Bridge/Remedial/Add on courses, clearly out line academic calendar, Mentoring system, projects for M.Phil. and PG students, enrichment through staff development programmes, major evaluation reforms, timely declaration of the examination results, clearly stated learning outcomes and good pass percentage were the salient features of the teaching-learning-evaluation methods.

The team appreciated the infrastructural facilities available to augment research activities. Two research instrumentation laboratories equipped with latest instruments, major and minor projects, staff research centre, publication of research papers, monographs and books, encouragement given by the college to provide consultancy services, extension activity as part of the curriculum, collaboration at the regional, national and international levels to promote curriculum development, on the job training, MoUs signed were noteworthy steps taken towards the promotion of research, extension and consultancy. The team also made a mention on the good infrastructural facilities and the maximum utilization of the infrastructure, automated library using software eBlis, latest computing facilities, computer aided teaching – learning materials, man power for repair and maintenance work.

The efforts taken for personal enhancement of students and development schemes, coaching classes for competitive examinations, active alumni association, good pass percentage, and participation of students in cocurricular and extracurricular activities are evidences of student support and progression. The explicit internal organizational structure, welfare measures for the staff, academic audit and the functioning of the IQAC was appreciated.

The team made a mention of the ecofriendly campus, energy conservation, water harvesting and E-Waste management. The certificate programme for prisoners and courses conducted for refugees, social extension work by all the departments are special features of the college as noted by the peer team.

Good team work, participatory decisions, democratic leadership, cordial relationship between faculty and students, and supportive management are the institutional strengths. Poor communication skills and lack of ambition of the students are the institutional weaknesses. The peer team suggested that the alumni association be registered and the library administration and automation be more effective, more research projects to be taken up by teachers and to enhance quality publication. The team recommended that the college may introduce programs like M.Sc. Visual Communication, MCA and PG in all the departments, degree courses in Fashion Technology, Hotel Management and Entrepreneurship and apply for College with Potential for Excellence and University status.

The management would like to appreciate the efforts undertaken by the faculty members in enhancing the quality of research. 34 papers from the Department of Tamil, 24 from Mathematics, 16 from English, 23 from Business Administration, 10 from Zoology, 7 from Chemistry, 10 from Computer Applications, 3 from Commerce, 3 from Banking and Insurance, 1 from Physics and 1 from Hindi have been peer reviewed and published in National and International Journals. The management would also like to appreciate Dr. Venum Cecilia P. A. from the Department of English, Dr. Beulah Suresh and Dr. Renuga Devi S. from Business Administration for obtaining their Ph.D. guidship from the Thiruvalluvar University. The college congratulates 18 faculty members of Auxilium College for their success in SET Exams, this academic year. 4 Ph.D.s' in English and 6 Ph.D.'s in Chemistry have been awarded this academic year.

Formative Programs

Upgrading, encouraging and motivating staff to adopt current trends besides nurturing healthy relationship with students has ever been the prime concern of the Auxilium Community. To serve this interest, various formative programs were organized. The academic year 2016-17 began with a 3-day Orientation Program for freshers and young teaching staff, addressed by Ms. Rhona Nunes, Former Head, Dept. of English and Dr. Sr. Jayaceli, Head, Dept. of Tamil. An orientation was organised for teaching staff presided by Dr. Joseph Kuruvilla, Retd. Selection Grade Senior in Hospital and Health System Management CMC, who emphasised on student-teacher relationship. An orientation on Value Education chaired by Dr. A. Joseph Einstein, Consultant Professional Psychologist Holistic Trainer and Counsellor provided insights to the importance of developing value-based education to enhance academic attainment.

Certificate Course

The college offers the following inter-disciplinary and career-oriented UGC funded certificate courses.

The Human Resource Management & Development Certificate Course offered by the Department of Commerce, Shift I coordinated by Dr. (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Head, Department of Commerce is a bi-semester program working on industrial visits to Aavin Milk Industry, Hotel River View, Ambur Sugars, Wintonia Footwear Ltd., etc.

Entrepreneurial Development Certificate Course also coordinated by Dr (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Head, Department of Commerce, Shift I in collaboration with Vellore Institute of Commerce is a four-month course on evolution of the entrepreneurs from all walks of life to enhance entrepreneur skills in BBA and B.Com. students with theoretical and practical assistance scheduled for Saturdays.

The Human Rights and Values in Education Certificate Course offered by the Department of History, coordinated by Ms. K. Dhanabakyam, educates and keeps students informed on human rights by arranging visits to social welfare agencies engaged in safeguarding human rights.

The Department of English offers a **Certificate Course in Communication Skills** open to UG second-year students of the college, working on promoting communicative skills, under the guidance of Dr. Venum Cecilia, Head, Dept. of English. The course design focuses on improving productive skills besides developing listening and reading competencies.

The Department of Zoology, offers a **Certificate Course in Medical Laboratory Technique** coordinated by Dr. J.Arockia Mary, Associate Prof. Department of Zoology in which 36 students have enrolled.

The Rural Handicraft Certificate Course offered by the Department of Tamil coaches students in learning various skills such as paper ornaments and jewel making, handwork in wool and textile material. All the hand-made exhibits were displayed in an Exhibition organised by the Dept. on 26th August, 2016.

The MS-Office Certificate Course offered by The Department of Computer Science Shift I & II provides a Course in Computer Science to the students of all the departments.

Centre for ICWA, CA, RRB, LIC, CAT and TNPSC Coaching

The College is a recognized coaching centre under the Institute of Cost Accountants. Dr. (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Asso. Prof. Dept. of Commerce and Ms. Auxilia Antony coordinate the coaching classes for IAS, LIC, Railways, ICWAI, CAT, TIME Organization, P.O Banks, CA (Group I and II), IIBF and TNPSC. 70 students have registered their names for the class especially for Group –IV exams.

Centre for UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR NET and SET Coaching

The College is also a recognized centre for coaching classes for UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR NET and SET Exams with Dr. V. Suganthakumari, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Chemistry as the coordinator. 156 students enrolled and benefited by the classes in General Paper. NET and SET Paper I has also been included in the curriculum for PG students in the third semester of the academic year. The credit of 9 candidates having cleared the SET exams testifies the benefit of the classes.

Sports and Games

The concept of a sound mind in a sound body reverberated in the campus through the efforts of the Department of Physical Education. The department conducted the Inter Departmental tournaments for our students in Volley Ball, Basket Ball, Throw Ball, Hand Ball, Hockey, Foot Ball, Cricket, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Table Tennis, Shuttle Badminton, Ball Badminton, Chess and Athletics. 13 teams representing the college have been actively involved in sports and games. 40 hours Physical Fitness Programme has been conducted for I Year students, at the beginning of the academic year. At the Inter Collegiate tournaments our ssteam was the winners in Kabaddi and Runners – up in Shuttle Badminton, Volley Ball, Cricket and Foot Ball. 76 of our students participated in the International Yoga Day Program conducted by Thiruvalluvar University. 250 of our students participated in the Marathon Race conducted by the Income Tax Department and one student secured the IV Place. In the International Sports and Cultural Program (RIVERA) organized by VIT University Vellore, 31 students participated and G. Manju I MSW secured 1st place in shot-put and 3rd place in javelin along with a cash award. 10 of our students secured 3 I prizes, 3 II prizes and 4 III Prizes in the State Level Public Sports Meet organised by the Tamil Nadu Police Department. 17 of our students received Rs. 24,000/- cash award from Sports Development Authority of Tamil Nadu for participating in the South

Zone Inter University tournaments, All Inter University Tournaments and as members of Foot Ball Winning team for the year 2014-2015.

Auxilium Research Cell organised a lecture cum workshop on the topic *Enhancing Quality Research in Higher Education* for PG and M. Phil students. Students were addressed by Resource persons on topics related to their respective fields of research. 17 PG and M.Phil. students have presented papers and won cash prizes for the best presentation. A workshop on Human Rights addressed by Sr. Isabella Alphonse, coordinated by Dr. (Sr.) Regina, was organised for I PG students of all Departments. A Video Conference on *Disaster Risk Reduction* is on the pipeline in the first week of March, which is to be addressed by Dr. Peter Davey, Director of Environmental Management School, Griffith University, Australia.

IQAC- The Internal Quality Assurance Cell organised a one-day UGC sponsored State Level Workshop on *Enhancing Quality in Higher Educational Institutions through Innovations and Best Practices* in which faculty from various colleges in Tamil Nadu participated. A one day seminar on *Service Learning in Environment* was conducted for all the teaching staff of the college addressed by Dr. Azhagapa Moses, Associate Professor and Head, Dept. of Environmental Science and Dr. Anand Karunakaran, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Physics, Bishop Heber College, Tiruchirapalli focusing on Green Audit, Energy Audit and Biodiversity Register. In collaboration with United Board, Hong Kong, UGC and NAAC sponsorship, a three-day National Conference titled *Journey towards Excellence* was organized. The conference threw light on the seven criteria for assessment. 15 resource persons delivered resource talks which were followed by group discussions and plenary sessions.

Association Activities

The activities of the **English Association** commenced with an inaugural lecture by Dr. Vasugi K. on Diaspora. The Sr. Celine D'Souza Memorial Lecture was chaired by Dr. Bava Chelladurai, Writer and member of Sahitya Academy, Ms. Shailaja, Translator and Rev. Joshua Peter, Director Quo-Vadis, who spoke on Translation and gave insights into themes related Indian Translation. The department pamphlet *Harper* was released by the Chair Person. The Department signed an MOU with Ebek – Business English Course, Language Laboratories Pvt. Ltd. and Mr. Nelson, Ebek Chennai, gave a talk on the importance of English communication and Examination. 61 students have registered and will take the Cambridge Examinations in April. An International Conference on *Innovations in English Language Teaching and Literary Studies* was organised in honour of the retiring Principal Dr. (Sr.) Ugini Fathima Mary in which around 80 participants presented papers. A Peace Essay Writing Competition based on the Pope's message is organized every academic year. A Rolling Shield for participation in creative competitions was awarded to the College by the Shakespeare Institute of English, Chennai in which Ms. Thendral of I English won a Gold Medal and Shyanla of II English got a Silver Medal at the state level. COLLEGE DAY ADDRESS

Dr. Padma Bhushan Arogiasamy Paulraj

Sr. Amaloparvam, Secretary, Auxilium College Sr. Celine Arogyaswami, distinguished guests, faculty members and dear students. It is indeed a honour to be join you today on the occasion of college day celebration of Auxilium College. Thank you Sisters for inviting me. I am very happy to see my sister – Sr. Celine being felicitated today on her Golden Jubilee which she completed recently. Sr. Celine joined the Salesian Order while serving as a chemistry lecturer in this college in the mid 1960s. Our family has been very proud of Sr. Celine and she remains or guide and advisor.

Auxilium College was founded 63 years ago by Mother Cesira Gallina and has grown to become a multi disciplinary institution, with an outstanding faculty, accomplished alumni and excellent students. My congratulations to the current and past generations of most dedicated religious and lay leadership that has built this institution to what is today. We have much to be proud off. My remarks today address three areas- a rapidly changing world, women's advancement and advice to students.

The world we live is changing rapidly, driven in large part by advancements in technology. It is hard to grasp the profound changes in society likely in the ext 15-20 years. Looking back 15 years we can see how the arrival of the internet and smart phones has improved our lives, made us more connected and created many career opportunities. The arrival of yet new technologies over the next 15-20 years will have a much bigger impact on our lives.

The value to society from all these advances can be huge- delivering healthier and lives as well as well- paying and creative jobs. But there is also a dark side- man y of the jobs we have today will disappear and though fresh ones will be created, they will need completely new sets of skills that may not be easy to acquire. The results of the recent elections in the USA is a warning of the problems that technology can bring. India has so far benefited enormously from technology but major job losses in our society from future technologies may not be far away. The key to survive and prosper in the new world is education and indeed continuous education, which prepares us for the ever changing jobs in sciences, humanities and engineering. Auxilium College should find ways to prepare young women for a rapidly evolving economy and job markets.

Now here are for some remarks about women in today's society. After India's independence, the laws and statutes of our country have given women many rights, by no means complete, but very substantial. However, in practice we see a different reality, Traditions like treating women as second-class citizens, denying them equal opportunities in jobs, domestic

violence, demand for dowry inequities in inheritance and property ownership, insufficient education of girl children and other examples are still far too common. Even more egregious are unfair divorce laws in certain communities. Those are bad traditions.

The division of labor due to the differences in biology between men and women does not justify and unequal or oppressive arrangement. In many ancient societies, women had equal rights to men. However, over the years, particularly in capitalistic economies, this division of labor became a relationship of dominance and oppression. All the evidence shows that communities that give their daughters the same opportunities as their sons, are more peaceful, are more prosperous, develop faster and are more likely to succeed.

Today, technology has increasingly helped free women from the “division of labor” rationale. Technology has reduced the chores of domestic labor and helped with caring of the young children. Women can increasingly take part fully in the work force. Women’s empowerment begins at home. Education in humanities is also essential, both for men and women, as this gives us an understanding of how the world works and a sense of our own place in it and helps us participate more effectively in our community and in political life.

History shows that advancements in women’s rights can easily be rolled back if we are not vigilant. We need to be organized both socially and politically to protect what we already have and further advance women’s rights. We should all work for a society in which every woman is treated with respect and dignity, every boy and girl is loved and cared for equally, and every family has the hope of a strong and stable future.

Let me offer some on your personal goals among which I must include the fulfilling of your potential. This is not just a matter of being successful in your chosen career but also fulfilling your potential as a human being – your potential for helping others, your potential for learning and creativity, your potential to lead by inspiring others, and finally your potential for hard work. If you study how people have advanced society- whether it be in creating public institutions, or driving societal reform or developed new technologies, you will find that an essential element of their success is persistence. Success rarely comes quickly, it takes persistence and hard work to do worthwhile things.

Finally, whatever may the challenges that face India, I am convinced that our future as a country is bright as long we remain committed to our values of a democratic, secular, and

pluralistic society where people of every ethnicity, every religion, and every language can live as equals and where every life is equally valued. If we can keep these values, everything else will fall in place. Let me end with wishing all the students, faculty and staff all success in your endeavors. May God Bless all of you and Auxilium College.

He has also won over a dozen defense and National Awards in India, including ‘ the Scientist of the year Award and distinguished Alumni Award (IIT Delhi).

Dr.Paulraj holds many prestigious positions such as:

- Member of the United States National Academy of Engineering;
- Member of the American Male Scientists of Indian descent among the Indian engineers of the 20th century and Scientists of Tamilnadu.
