### **Research and Consultancy**

Auxilium College explored different areas of research and consultancy this academic year. Dr. (Ms.) Sugantha Kumari, Assistant Professor of Chemistry, completed a Major Research Project worth Rs.25 lakhs 98 thousand, funded by the DST Fast Track Project under the scheme, Young Women Scientist award.

Dr. Amutha Arockiamary, Dr. Kalaiselvi and Ms. Devanayagi Assistant Professors of English were conferred M.Phil. Guideship this year.

## **Publications**

The academic world is ruled by the dictum - ‘publish or perish’. Auxilium College strives to enhance knowledge, skill and research by publishing books and research articles. The Members of the faculty have published 109 research papers in reputed, peer-reviewed journals. Dr. (Ms.) Sugantha Kumari, Assistant Professor of Chemistry has published a book titled *Polysaccharide Nanosystems as Scaffolds for Tissue Engineering*. The Members of the English Faculty have designed a text book for the Foundation Course in English titled *Darts*, published by Bloomsbury. Dr. Preetha, Assistant Professor of Tamil, published a book titled *Agananootril Malargal Pesum Maruthuva Mozhi*.

## **Formative Programmes**

Various formative programmes were organized for the Faculty Members to enhance their skills in teaching and tone-up their interaction with students. A three-day Orientation Programme on the *Salesian Methods of Education* was held for the junior members of the faculty with Rev. (Fr.) Mani Lazar. Salesian Province Youth Director, Chennai, as the Resource Person, Dr. D. Jeyakar Chellaraj, Former Principal, Bishop Heber College, Trichy, gave an Orientation Programme on, *Teaching that Transforms*.

## **Certificate Courses**

The college offers the following inter-disciplinary and career-oriented UGC-funded certificate courses.

**The Human Resource Management & Development Certificate Course** offered by the Department of Commerce (Shift I) is a bi-semester programme. About 28 students went on an Industrial visit to Twilight Software, Pudhucherry. Mecno Valves Engineer, Vellore and Uday Woods Interior, Vellore conducted recruitment for the students.

**Certificate Course in Human Rights and Values in Education** offered by the Department of History, coordinated by Sr. Sumathi, Head, Department of History, educates students in human rights by arranging visits to social welfare agencies, engaged in safeguarding human rights. Quiz competitions based on current affairs in India and world, people and persons, and general knowledge are conducted regularly.

The Department of English offers a **Certificate Course in Communication Skills in English** sponsored by the UGC, to help students improve their skills in communicative English. The course is coordinated by Dr. Venum Cecilia, Head, Dept. of English.

The Department of Zoology, offers a **Certificate Course in Medical Laboratory Techniques** coordinated by Dr. J.S. Arockia Mary, Associate Prof. of Zoology. 76 students were enrolled for the course this academic year.



**Certificate Course in Rural Handicraft** offered by the Department of History imparts the skills required for self-employability and trains students in embroidery, tailoring, jewel and toy making,

**Certificate Course in MS-Office**, offered by the Department of Computer Science and Computer Applications trains students in the basic computer skills.

### **Centre for ICAI, CA, RRB, LIC, CAT and TNPSC Coaching**

The College is a recognized coaching centre under the Institute of Cost Accountants of India, with Dr. (Sr.) Sheila Susairaj, Vice-Principal (Shift II) as the Co-ordinator for IAS, LIC, Railways, ICAI, CAT, TIME Organization, P.O Banks, CA (Group I and II), IIBF exams. Dr. (Ms.) Auxilia Antony coordinates the TNPSC coaching classes.

### **Centre for UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR NET and SET Coaching**

The College is also a recognized centre for coaching classes for UGC-NET, UGC-CSIR and SET Exams with Dr. V. Suganthakumari, Assistant Professor, Dept. of Chemistry as the coordinator. 202 students have been enrolled and benefited by the classes in General Paper. NET/SET Paper-I has been included in the curriculum for PG students in the third semester. 9 candidates have cleared the SET exams this year.

### **Sports and Games**

Sports and Games maintain a positive and fresh outlook towards life improving both physical and mental health of our students. The first years were given 40 hours of physical fitness in the beginning of the year. The intramural tournaments in Volleyball, Basketball, Football, Handball, Hockey, Cricket, Ball Badminton, Shuttle Badminton, Table Tennis, Chess and Athletic events were conducted for the students. The Annual Sports Meet was held on 12<sup>th</sup> August, 2017. The chief guest was Mrs. Vanitha, DIG (Deputy Inspector General, Vellore Range). T. Vidhya of II year B.Sc. Physics represented the south zone in the All India Football League Tournament held at the Lakshmibai National University of Physical Education (LNIPE), Gwalior, Madhya Pradesh and she was a member of the winning team at the National level. V. Deepika of II B.Sc Chemistry participated in the Inter-University Athletics Meet held at Acharya Nagarjuna University, Andhra Pradesh.

The sports ground of Auxilium College was lent for many sports activities conducted by various organisations throughout the year. Auxilium College was given the opportunity by the Regional Director, Collegiate Education to host the Intercollegiate Hockey and Shuttle Badminton Tournaments as part of the centenary celebrations of the birth of the Former Chief Minister Dr. M.G.R. The Auxilium Volley Ball, Shuttle Badminton and Basket Ball teams won the match. Auxilium College Shuttle Badminton and Hockey teams participated in the state level tournaments organised by the Directorate of Collegiate Education, Chennai.

In the Chief Minister trophy tournaments conducted at the District Level by the Sports Development Authority of Tamilnadu (SDAT), Auxilium Shuttle Badminton and Basketball teams performed excellently and 17 of our students received a cash award of Rs.1000 each.

At the National level Cricket tournaments 2017-2018 conducted by the BCCI, G.Manju, of II M.S.W represented Tamil Nadu in the National Ranji Trophy tournaments T20 and One-day tournaments. Her performance was extraordinarily good and was appreciated by the Cricket lovers very much; she had taken a number of wickets with ease and her batting style was very elegant as commented by one and all. At present she is away at Vijayawada, playing for Tamilnadu. K.Nadhini of III BBA represented the Tamil Nadu State Cricket under19 held at Vijayawada.

At the International Athletics Meet organised by VIT University, G.Manju secured the first place in 400 metres and 800 metres running and shot put. S.Monica Florence of I BCA secured the second place in 100 metres, 200 metres and 400 metres running. A group of 5 students participated in Basketball, 2 in Hockey, 2 in Football and 2 in Athletics held at the State level Chief Minister Trophy tournaments held in Thiruvannamalai, Trichy, Dindigul and Chennai respectively. Hearty congratulations to the winners, participants and the very energetic Directresses of Physical Education Dr. D. Mary Reethammal and Ms.Thennilavu.

### **Auxilium Research Cell**

**Auxilium Research Cell** organizeda Seminar on 'Cyber Crime and Female Victimization'. Dr Ranit Oomman Abraham, Asst. Professor, School of Excellence in Law, Dr.Ambedkar Law University, Chennai, Dr. Michael Valan and Dr. Sowmya, Assistant Professors, Department of Criminology and Police Administration, from D.G. Vaishnav College,

Chennai were the resource persons. A workshop and video conference on *Challenges and Opportunities for Women Researchers* was organized to mark the International Women's Day. Prof. Datin Dr. Norizan Abdul Razak, Director, Tun Fatimah Hashim Women Leadership Centre, Faculty of Social Sciences and Humanities, University of Kabangsaan, Malaysia and a team of students and research scholars from Malaysia interacted with our PG students and Research Scholars on various aspects of women and research, interdisciplinary studies and the role of technology in research. Later Dr. Meenakshi, Assistant Professor, VIT University, gave a talk on the hardships faced by women researchers.

### **Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)**

The **Internal Quality Assurance Cell** organised a workshop on '*Rules and Responsibilities of Non-Teaching Staff in the Development of the College*' for the Non-Teaching Staff. Rev. Dr. C.M. Varghese, Rector and Principal, Don Bosco College, Dharmapuri and Mr. Ganesan M.Sc., Accounts Officer, Joint Directorate of College Education (JDCE), Vellore facilitated the workshop. IQAC successfully conducted the Academic Audit and Administrative Audit. An "Open Student Form" was initiated successfully, to ensure the representation and participation of the students in the planning and execution of the academic activities of the college. The Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) was prepared and submitted to the NAAC. The members of the Auxilium Students' Quality Cell created awareness among students on gender abuse, usury, child abuse, role of students in the family and effects of selfie addiction, through street plays and skits during common assemblies and were actively involved in ensuring quality by taking part in instructional, motivational and review meetings, data entry and digitizing the library resource materials, maintaining discipline in and out of the class rooms, maintaining the cleanliness of the campus during break time and taking measures for the students to acquire good communicative skills in English. The ASQC members organized a poster competition on the topic "Importance of traffic rules and Road safety".

### **Association Activities**

The **English Association** commenced its activities with the inauguration of English Literary Association, Theatre and Journalism Clubs. The Chief Guest, Ms. Illakiya Victoria, IAS (Past pupil of Auxilium) interacted with the students giving useful tips and suggestions on preparing for Civil Services Exams. The Inter-Departmental Theatre Fest organised by the

department showcased the theatrical skills of the students. The Department of English 'B' Section in Shift I and the Department of Business Administration in Shift II secured the first place and Ms. Arul Selvi of I English 'B' Section, Shift I and Amritha Varshini of III B.Com., Shift II won the Best Actress Award. The Department coordinated the Ebec Business English Course certified by Cambridge University; around 70 students were enrolled for the course and the examinations will be conducted in May 2018. An inter-collegiate competition 'Auxilium Lit-fete' was organised to mark the Triple celebrations of the Diamond Jubilee of the Undergraduate course, the Vicennial of the Postgraduate Course and Decennial of Research studies in English. The Jubilee year of the department was marked by a workshop for teachers on *Communication through Storytelling and Fairytale Therapy* facilitated by Dr. Eric Miller, Director, World Storytelling Institute, Chennai. ## Rare bas-relief Jyeshta and Gajalakshmi Sculpture

(Discovery by the Department of History along with the Archaeology Department)

A bas-relief sculpture of “one of the oldest goddesses to be worshipped”. Jyeshta Devi – has been discovered by a team led by an archaeologist. As the sculpture carries the images of goddesses Jyeshta Devi and Gajalakshmi, it is “a rare and unique finding”, according to the team members.

The team led by **Mr. M. Chandramoorthy**, former Deputy Director of Archaeology, Government of Tamil Nadu comprised **Dr. K. A. Kavitha**, Assistant Professor, Department of History and **Ms. S. Manimegalai**, Assistant Professor, Department of Tamil, Auxilium College, Vellore. Four III year students of the Department of History were also part of the team, **Ms. J Jothiga**, **Ms. S. ThamaraiSelvi**, **Ms. M. Chandrakumari** and **Ms. S. Chandralekha**.

During a field visit on January 7, they stumbled upon a bas-relief sculpture of Jyeshta Devi and Gajalakshmi that is worshipped at a Bathrakali temple in Oyathur near Thirumanivillage, Katpaditaluk. The slab measures 78 cm in height, 136 cm in breadth. Jyeshta Devi, also known as ‘**Moodevi**’ was a goddess who was worshipped during the Pallava and Chola period. However, the worship of this goddess started to decline as time passed by, Mr. M. Chandramoorthy said.

Sculptures of Jyeshta Devi had been in the Pallava ruled land – Thondaimandalam – comprising Kancheepuram, Chengalpet and North Arcot districts. “We have seen sculptures of the goddess from the Mahendravarman period – that is 592 to 630 A.D. But this sculpture, based on its style, appearance of face and characteristics, belongs to pre-Mahendravarman period, that is Simmavarman or Simhavishnu period, which is 600 A.D.,” Mr. M. Chandramoorthy said. The sculpture is about 1,400 years old. Gajalakshmi is seated on a lotus with two hands in the posture of Padmasana. Her right hand holding lotus in Kataga Hasta and her left hand on thigh (Ooru Hasta). She wears **jatabaraon** on her head, **olaikundala** in ears, and necklace on the neck. Gajalakshmi’s height is 63 cm, total breadth is 54 cm, and shoulder is 22 cm. The Secretary of Auxilium College, Rev. Sr. Amalorpavam S. J., Principal Dr. (Sr.) Mary Josephine Rani A. and Head of the History Department Sr. M. Sumathicongratulated the team members.
