

St. Don Bosco's Feast—31 January



WHATSAPP'S STATUS IS AN EMOTIONAL SELF-PRESENTATION

Self-presentation is a crucial component of human communication and can be defined as "the process through which individuals communicate an image of themselves to others" (Yang and Brown, 2015: 404)

Self-presentation in online and face-to-face interactions has been extensively explored. The majority of online research, however, has concentrated on social networking sites, blogs, chat rooms, etc., while paying less attention to other online communication tools like WhatsApp, despite the fact that WhatsApp is becoming an increasingly important tool for communication. Using an

analysis of selfpresentation on WhatsApp and a focus on emotional self-

presentation in profile status.

According to Kim and Dindia (2011), Yang and Brown (2015), it is a dynamic process that evolves along five main interconnected dimensions: intentionality, depth, positivity, authenticity, and breadth. Self-presentation can also elicit

strong emotions. For instance, sharing personal feelings might be positively recognized by other group members, who then could recognize their own feel-



ings in return. Yet, oversharing can also have negative consequences and result in rejection from other people, both in real-world interactions and online (Altman and Taylor, 1973). Self

presentation now takes place both face-to

-face and digitally in the form of a profile due to the growing usage of the Internet for communication.

In fact, the majority of WhatsApp users choose their profile image and status deliberately since they know that other users will see it anytime they exchange phone numbers.

When the "status" feature of WhatsApp was updated to coincide with its 8th birthday. The updated version allowed users

to submit a 24-hour status in a manner akin to Snapchat rather than allowing them to add a short phrase next to their profile photo. Yet barely one month later, on March 24, 2017, WhatsApp was

obliged to reinstate the old statuses because of the overwhelmingly negative response from users whom we of ask overwhelmingly turn to the textual status.

A recent study by Facebook revealed that people who share statuses about their relationships are insecure. Research also indicates that these status updates are not necessarily 100% reflective of the reality of their situation. People post in order to get a reaction and most of them crave support.

It is very important to understand for the status viewer that these status updates are not a documentation of the user's (user posting updates on status) life. These statuses should

never be taken to heart and one should never compare oneself to the lives of others based on these status activities.

In addition to this, status updates can expose one's personal life, and feelings and make him/her vulnerable to exploitation. Henceforth, one should refrain from posting sensitive content on social media platforms and understand the fact that anything and everything on social media is not true.

> banned the usage of this Chat GPT inside the campus and for academic submissions like assignments. The younger generation must use technology in a healthier way it





empty handed. So, the best thing was to quit right away. As Naleena was about to leave, suddenly she heard a voice behind her, "Naleena come in. where are you going?". With a of mixture fear and confusion she turned and it was Fr Jacob who called her. She went in and he made her sit down and she wished him. "It was his birthday, but why was I feeling important?", she marveled. These acts of treating her with respect she said took her a long way in her fight to assert the rights of the transgender community. After few years she had passed out of the college, Fr. Jayasheelan even invited her as the chief guest for a program in the hostel and celebrated her choice.

Before the Loyola experience, Naleena was a shattered person. Her family disowned her. Soci-

Though from a humble beginning, Naleena's association with Jesuits has transformed her into a dauntless voice for her community. She is a visible symbol of how values like loving-kindness and respect without any discrimination can empower those that are less recognized and under privileged in our communities, institutions and societies. Let us all learn to be more humane and kind to all.






