emerged as winners.

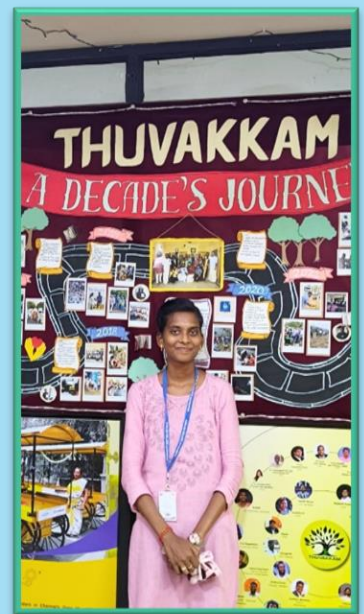
