**Report on the Execution of Geneva Conventions Day Competitions held in

As part of the 76th Anniversary of Geneva Conventions Day Celebrations, the Youth Red Cross (YRC) Unit, Auxilium College, organized Essay Writing and Oratorical competitions in English and Tamil as directed by the Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu State Branch, under Ref. No: IRCS – TNB / YRC /024/ 2025 – 2026 dated 19.07.2025. The events were successfully conducted at Auxilium College with enthusiastic participation from various colleges. The competitions included:

1. Essay Writing (English) on the topic “Red Cross & its importance in the current day”



Report on *Voluntary Blood Donation Camp*

The National Service Scheme (NSS), Red Ribbon Club (RRC), Youth Red Cross (YRC), and Kanali Women's Cell of Auxilium College (Autonomous), Vellore, in collaboration with the Christian Medical College, Vellore Blood Centres (Vellore &

Ranipet Campuses), organized a *Voluntary Blood Donation Camp* on **20th August 2025 (Wednesday) from **10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m.** at Auxilium College premises.**

The camp was inaugurated in the presence of the college management and coordinators of the organizing committees. The medical team from Christian Medical College, Vellore, facilitated the donation process by ensuring all medical guidelines and safety measures were strictly followed.

The event received an enthusiastic response from students, faculty, and staff members, many of whom voluntarily came forward to donate blood. The donors were medically screened before donation to ensure their eligibility and were appreciated for their noble gesture. 250 donors came forward out of which 30 donors were found eligible to donate blood amounting to 30 Units.
