
SWACHH BHARATH AWARENESS RALLY & VELLORE FORT MASS CLEANING

These actions and measures have been shown to increase "National Societies" acceptance, security and access to people and communities in need. Mrs. Priyadharshni. V.R. Asst. Prof Dept of English and YRC Program Office Auxilium College (Autonomous), Managing Committee member, Vellore District, YRC Sub Committee member IRCS, TNB attended the workshop.

DAY 1:

The program began with a warm welcome by Personal Secretary of the General Secretary Mr.P. Vengadaswam at 10.00 AM He invited Dr. Harish L. Metha, Hon. Chairman IRCS NB to welcome the gathering. - Six elements of SAF


SESSION 2:

SESSION 3:

This session dealt with Context and Risk discussion in environment. The volunteers were divided into 5 teams with 6 members in which the root cause of the Problems, Risk and challenges faced by different district were discussed and identified by Mr. John George. The session came to end with Introduction to benchmarking.



DAY 2

The day began with a recap of day 1 topics by Mrs. Priyadharshni.V.R Asst. Prof Dept of English and YRC Program Office Auxilium College (Autonomous), Managing Committee member, Vellore District, YRC Sub Committee member IRCS, TNB attended the workshop.

SESSION 4:

Mr. Sheik Nasar, Managing Committee member, Thanjavur District & RDRT Member briefed about the misuse of Red Cross emblem, how, where who and on what crisis should red cross symbol be used. He also explained how to educate the people regarding the usage of emblem.

SESSION 5:

This session was on Safer Access Framework bench mark. Mr. John George handled this session. He explained what is bench marking, how to access current bench mark, what is desired bench mark, what actions and plans can be done to reach the goal with the policies and the office. The teams were divided to work on SAF element to bring their ideas. After the group discussion, each team presented its ideas and added more inputs on this phase.

SESSION 6:

This session was a skit based on SAF elements, A scenario was given from that roles were decided and from the background of the story. The role play made the team to understand how the six elements are getting involved. 85. Juga 80h

INTERNATIONAL WORLD DISASTER REDUCTION DAY

DATE: 13.10.2019

The National Disaster Response Force (NDRF) - 4th Battalion, Arakkonam, and the Tamil Nadu Fire and Rescue Services, Vellore, conducted an awareness rally with Indian Red Cross Society Vellore District Branch and also conducted mock drills to demonstrate evacuation and rescue methods during earthquakes, firefighting techniques, rescue methods and ways to stay safe during disasters, on the occasion of International Day for Natural Disaster Reduction.

The programme, was inaugurated by Collector A. Shanmuga Sundram on Sunday, He flagged off a rally by school and college students on safety during disasters from the town hall near the Old Bus to Nethaji Stadium, after which a mock drill was conducted at the Nethaji Stadium in Vellore. Firefighters demonstrated methods to tackle blazes created due to oil and short circuits. They demonstrated how injured people trapped in a multistorey building could be safely rescued by using ladders or ropes. They provided helpful tips on how to tackle if someone's garments caught fire and how to treat burn with clean cold water.

On the other hand, the NDRF personnel took students to the places of disasters like earthquakes, with real-time models and made them understand the necessity to behave with alacrity during evacuation at a disaster site or any other accident sites.

In his address, Mr. Shanmuga Sundram told residents of Vellore that the district featured on the list of places at

risk of earthquakes and that they have to be prepared to tackle such an eventuality with smartly. He urged them to be alert during rainy days with essential items.



WATER BODIES ENCROACHED

The Collector pointed out the re-emerging trend of encroaching upon water bodies despite the government's effort to relocate them to a safer locality. This was done to keep them safe during floods, he said.

He said a rainfall of 17 cm left many areas of Vellore inundated for a few days. This was because of encroachments in water catchment areas around the city. Efforts were on to identify and relocate the inhabitants of such areas to safer locations. People need to cooperate with district administration in this endeavor, Mr. Shanmuga Sundram added.


