He inaugurated the session, Dr.Selvaguru K, ED Registrar, Emergency Department, CMC, Mr. Karthikeyan V, Paramedic Tutor, Emergency Department, CMC, Vellore, Ms.Anandhisaranya.R, Junior Emergency care technologist, Ms.Phebe Ann George Paramedic Intern were the trainers of the session.
