

The Mass Haemoglobin Screening Drive at Auxilium College was successfully organized by the NSS Unit in collaboration with Naruvi Hospitals, Vellore, with the objective of creating greater awareness about Anaemia among young women. A total of 3,676 individuals — including 3,434 students and 242 staff members — were screened efficiently within just 2 hours and 40 minutes.

This extraordinary accomplishment, titled “Maximum Haemoglobin Screening to Raise Anaemia Awareness among Young Women,” has been put forth as an official attempt for the India Book of Records and the Asia Book of Records.
